1. Which 2005 hurricane that struck Louisiana and Mississippi is the costliest in American history?

A. Katrina

B. Rita

C. Wilma

D. Dennis

This question hinges on recognizing which hurricane caused the greatest economic damage in U.S. history, specifically affecting Louisiana and Mississippi. Katrina earned that distinction because it produced by far the highest total damages, about \$125 billion in 2005 dollars, driven largely by catastrophic flooding in New Orleans after levees failed and the long, extensive recovery costs that followed. While other 2005 storms like Rita, Wilma, and Dennis were powerful and costly, none matched Katrina's scale, and Wilma mainly struck Florida while Dennis and Rita did not cause comparable losses in Louisiana and Mississippi. That combination—enormous damage concentrated in Louisiana and Mississippi—makes Katrina the correct choice.

2. The Mona Lisa is a portrait of the wife of Francesco del Giocondo. What is Francesco's relation to the subject?

A. Husband

B. Brother

C. Father

D. Son

Understanding family roles in a possessive description: when someone is called the wife of another person, that other person is her husband. The Mona Lisa is a portrait of the wife of Francesco del Giocondo, so Francesco is her husband. The other relations don't fit because they describe siblings or a parent-child link, not a spouse.

3. What is log base 10 of 10000?

A. 3

B. 4

C. 2

D. 5

The main idea is that a logarithm answers the question: to what power must the base be raised to obtain the given number? For a base of 10, you're looking for the exponent x such that $10^x = 10000$. Since 10^4 equals 10000, the exponent is 4. So $\log_{10}(10000) = 4$. You can see why by comparing nearby powers: 10^3 is 1000 and 10^5 is 100000, placing 10000 exactly at the fourth power of 10.

4. Which U.S. state has a panhandle that borders British Columbia?

- A. Idaho
- B. Montana
- C. Washington
- D. Oregon

A panhandle is a narrow, elongated extension of a state that reaches out toward a border. Idaho has a well-known northern panhandle that sticks up from the rest of the state, and that strip runs along the border with Canada, directly contacting British Columbia. That distinctive shape is why Idaho fits the question: it's the only option here whose panhandle borders British Columbia. The other states border BC in different ways or don't have a panhandle, so they don't fit the description as neatly.

5. In a regular hexagon, what is the measure of each interior angle?

- A. 120 degrees
- B. 90 degrees
- C. 108 degrees
- D. 135 degrees

When a polygon is regular, all interior angles are equal, and you can find their measure using the formula for a regular n-gon: interior angle = $(n - 2) \times 180^\circ / n$. Here $n = 6$, so the angle is $(4 \times 180^\circ) / 6 = 720^\circ / 6 = 120^\circ$. You can also see this by connecting the center to all vertices, forming six identical triangles with a central angle of 60° . Each triangle contributes two base angles of 60° , so the angle inside the hexagon is $60^\circ + 60^\circ = 120^\circ$. Therefore, each interior angle is 120 degrees. The other values correspond to polygons with different numbers of sides (square, pentagon, octagon).

6. Which network aired Generator Rex and Secret Mountain Fort Awesome?

- A. Cartoon Network
- B. Nickelodeon

Both shows are part of Cartoon Network's original lineup, which is known for strong, distinct animated series across action, adventure, and offbeat humor. Generator Rex is an action packed sci fi cartoon that aired on Cartoon Network, showcasing the channel's preference for dynamic, youth oriented animation. Secret Mountain Fort Awesome, created by Peter Browngardt, also appeared on Cartoon Network, fitting its edgy, quirky style. Because these two titles shared a network, Cartoon Network is the correct answer. The other networks—Nickelodeon, Disney Channel, and PBS Kids—have their own separate lineups and did not air these particular shows.

7. Katrina primarily affected which two states along the Gulf Coast?

A. Louisiana and Mississippi

B. Texas and Louisiana

C. Mississippi and Alabama

D. Florida and Alabama

Katrina's impact was defined by where the flooding and destruction were most severe along the Gulf Coast. The storm made landfall in southeastern Louisiana, and the catastrophic flooding of New Orleans came from levee failures in Louisiana. It then tracked across the region, delivering a powerful storm surge and damage along the Mississippi coast, especially in coastal towns like Biloxi and Gulfport. Because the heaviest damage and most significant consequences occurred in Louisiana and Mississippi, those are the two states most affected. While other Gulf states felt effects, they did not experience the same level of devastation as Louisiana and Mississippi.

8. Which term describes animals that eat both plants and animals?

A. Omnivores

B. Herbivores

C. Carnivores

D. Detritivores

The main idea here is how animals are categorized by what they eat. When an animal eats both plants and animals, that flexible diet is described as omnivory. This term fits because it specifically accounts for consuming a mix of plant matter (like fruits, vegetables, grains) and animal matter (like insects or meat), reflecting dietary versatility rather than a strict plant- or animal-based diet. Think of typical omnivores such as humans, bears, and pigs, whose meals can include a wide range of foods from produce to meat. In contrast, herbivores eat only plants, carnivores eat only animals, and detritivores feed on decomposing organic material, which isn't about consuming living plant and animal tissue.

9. In a ratio where cats to dogs is 4:7 and there are 44 animals total, how many cats are there?

A. 12

B. 16

C. 20

D. 18

Ratios describe how a whole is divided into equal parts. Here, cats to dogs is 4:7, so the total must be split into 4 parts for cats and 7 parts for dogs, which is 11 parts in all. With 44 animals total, each part is $44 \div 11 = 4$ animals. Since cats account for 4 parts, the number of cats is $4 \times 4 = 16$. A quick check: dogs would be 7 parts $\times 4 = 28$, and $16 + 28 = 44$, which matches the total.

10. A square has area 16. What is the side length?

A. 4

B. 2

C. 8

D. -4

For a square, the area equals the side length squared. If the area is 16, the side length is the square root of 16, which is 4. A negative value like -4 would also square to 16, but a side length cannot be negative, so 4 is the correct length. The other options would give different areas: 2 gives area 4, and 8 gives area 64.
