For instance, CC-SA (ShareAlike) mandates that any derivative works be licensed under the same terms but does not specifically emphasize the need to credit the original author in the way CC-BY does. CC-ND (No Derivatives) prohibits adaptations altogether, while CC-NC (NonCommercial) allows for use but restricts it to non-commercial scenarios. The specific requirement of providing credit is uniquely tied to the CC-BY license, highlighting its role in encouraging attribution as an integral part of content sharing.
