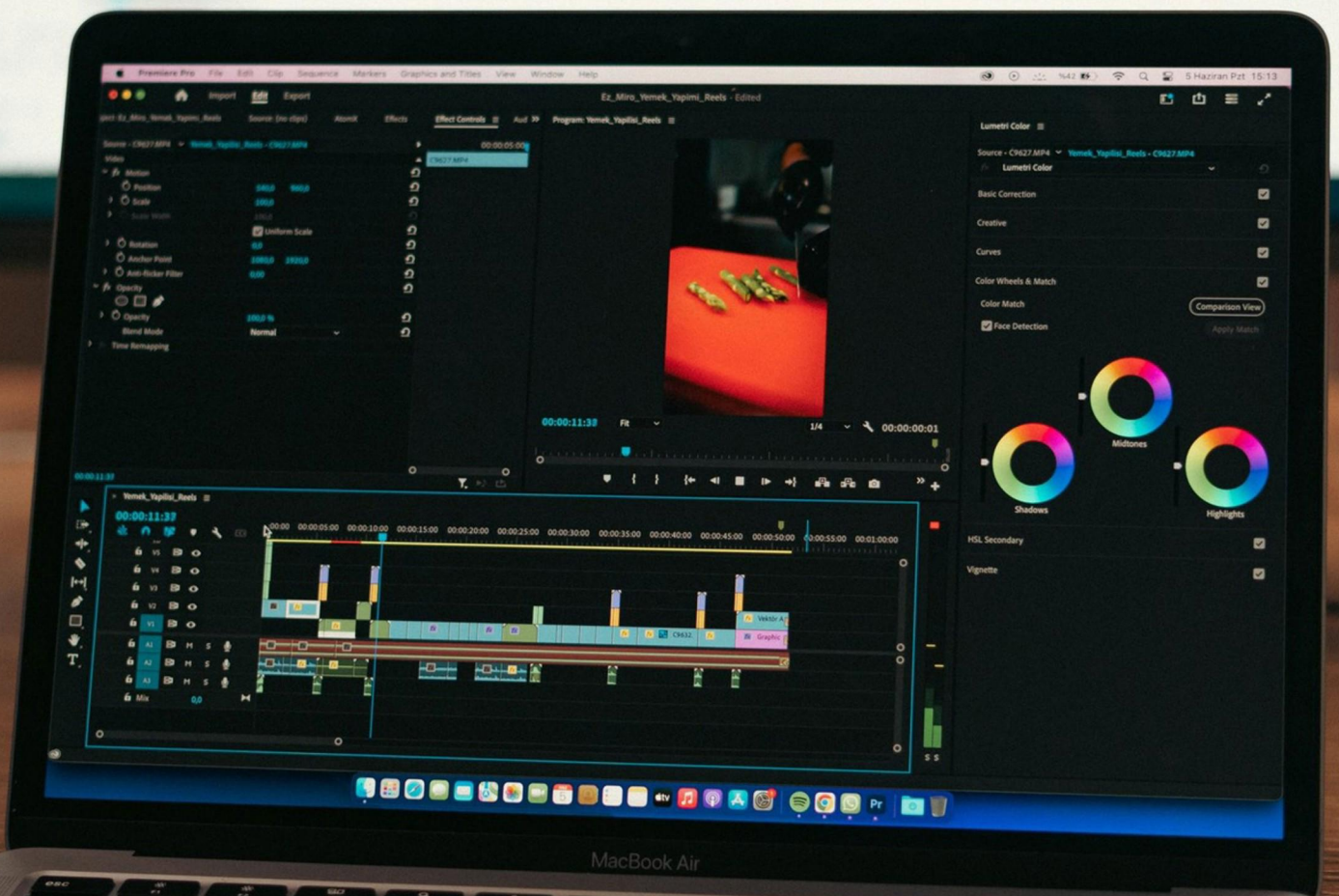

Hence, using the Type Tool is the most effective and straightforward method for adding text overlays.
