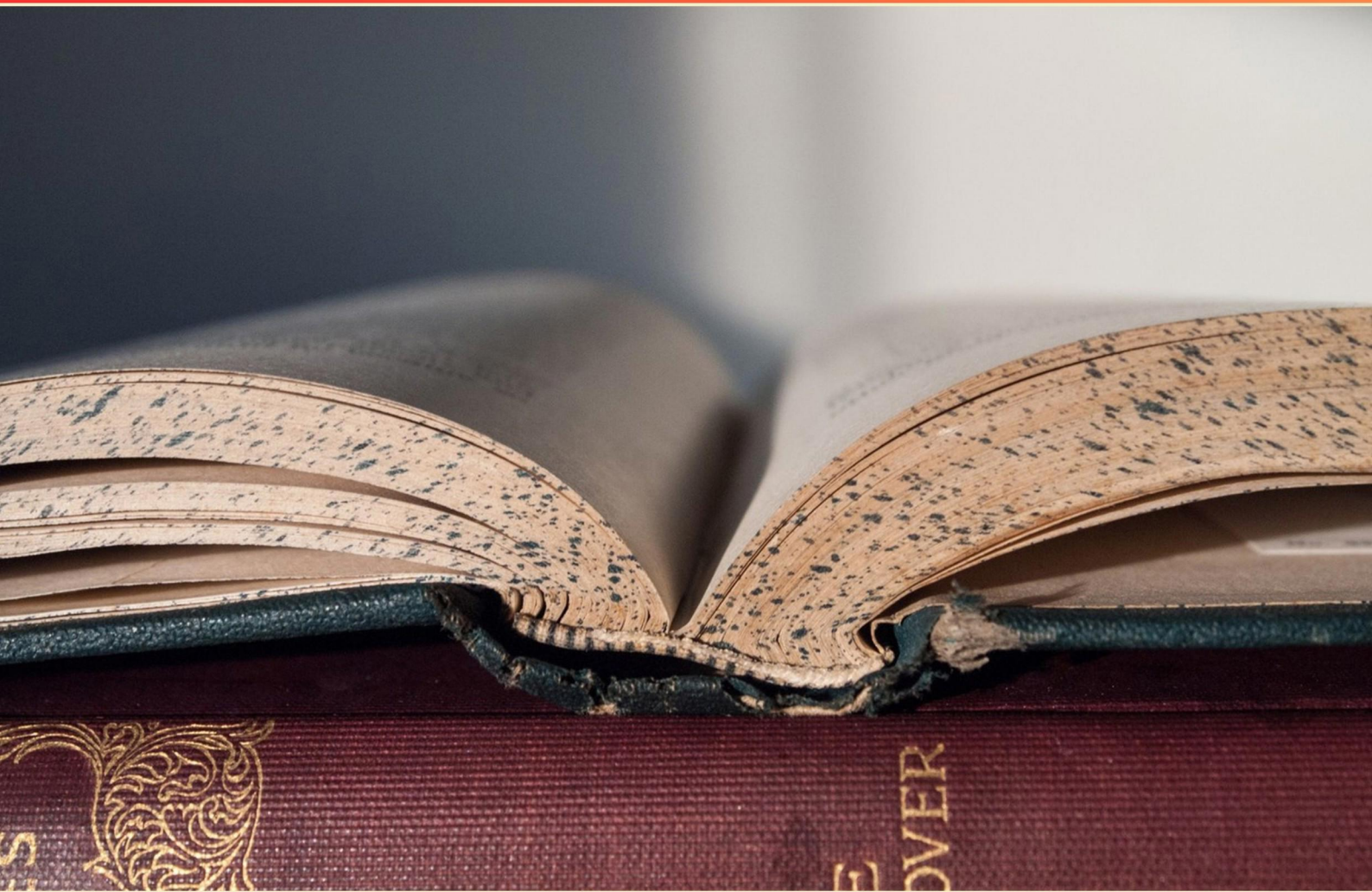

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Explanations

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1. What were the two characteristics of the reemerging church?

- A. Keep commandments of God and have faith in Jesus
- B. Proclaim the gospel to the nations and practice charity
- C. Emphasize church tradition and alter sacred days

The idea being tested is that the reemerging church in this context is identified by two fundamental practices: keeping the commandments of God and having faith in Jesus. This pairing reflects a balanced emphasis in Adventist history on both living out divine law (such as Sabbath observance and moral commandments) and trusting Christ for salvation. It shows that true faith is evidenced not only by belief but by obedience to God's will. This combination distinguishes it from other options that lean toward social action without the same emphasis on obedience, or that push tradition, altered sacred days, or broader ecumenism—neither of which captures the specific Adventist emphasis on both faith in Jesus and adherence to God's commandments.

2. In Revelation 12 prophecy, which figure is the dragon pursuing?

- A. The child (Jesus)

Satan's movement in Revelation 12 is driven by opposition to God's plan of salvation. The dragon's first aim is to devour the child born to the woman—the child represents Jesus. This immediate pursuit matches the text where the dragon stands ready to destroy him as soon as he is born. After Jesus' birth and his ascent, the drama shifts to persecution of the woman and, subsequently, of her offspring—the faithful followers who keep God's commandments and bear witness to Jesus. The angels aren't the target described in this scene. Understanding this sequence shows why the dragon's most direct pursuit is the child, not the angels.

3. Which description corresponds to the second phase of the cleansing of the sanctuary?

- A. The forgiveness of sins
- B. The cleansing of the sanctuary alone

The second phase of the cleansing of the sanctuary describes a twofold purification: sins are blotted out in the heavenly sanctuary during the investigative judgment, and then there is a cleansing of both the sanctuary and the individual believer—the blotting out of sin from the records of heaven as well as from the lives of believers. This reflects Adventist teaching that salvation includes clearing the heavenly records and preparing the people to stand righteous before God at the end of the judgment. The other options don't capture both aspects: forgiveness alone misses the sanctuary's cleansing, cleansing of the sanctuary alone misses the believer's cleansing, and the Second Coming is the event that follows these phases, not the phase itself.

During the early, formative years after the Great Disappointment, personal connections among Adventist leaders helped push the movement forward. In 1846, the Whites met Bates, a meeting that connected the White couple with a broader Sabbatarian circle and gave momentum to their developing ministry. This encounter helped strengthen their mission and contributed to spreading the emphasis on Sabbath observance and prophetic interpretation that would shape Adventist identity in the years ahead.

5. Who tried to prove Miller wrong about the 2300 day prophecy, and also predicted the fall of the Ottoman Empire in 1840?

The idea being tested is how prophetic timelines are tied to real-world events and how early Adventist teachers used current world events to evaluate or challenge a date set from biblical prophecy. Josiah Litch is the figure who did this: a Millerite preacher who argued that the 2300 days mentioned in Daniel could be connected to worldly events and used that approach to forecast a specific outcome—the fall of the Ottoman Empire in 1840. He published a tract in 1839 laying out this prediction, presenting it as a test of Miller's chronology. The hoped-for fulfillment would show that prophecy could be validated by events, not just by a fixed date. Although the Ottoman Empire did not fall in 1840, Litch's effort is notable for showing how Adventist teachers attempted to test and refine prophetic timelines by linking them to contemporary events.

6. Which passage identifies the gifts and roles Christ gave to equip the saints for ministry and to build up the body of Christ?

The important idea here is that Christ distributes specific leadership gifts to the church to prepare believers for service and to strengthen the whole body. Ephesians 4:11-13 names the offices—apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers—and explains their purpose: to equip the saints for works of ministry and to build up the body of Christ, so we all grow toward unity in faith and the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, reaching the fullness of Christ. Other passages don't fit as closely. Romans 12:6-8 discusses various gifts God gives to individuals, but it doesn't outline the particular offices or the corporate goal of building up the church in the way this passage does. Colossians 3:12 focuses on virtuous character qualities Christians should cultivate, not on gifts or offices. 1 Thessalonians 5:11 emphasizes encouraging and building one another up in daily life, rather than defining the gifted roles Christ gives to the church for ministry.

7. Which statement reflects the spiritual dimension of health in Ellen White's first health vision?

- A. Health is primarily physical

The main idea here is that health has a spiritual dimension, meaning caring for health is a duty connected to faith and one's relationship with God. In Ellen White's first health vision, she ties health reform directly to devotion and spiritual life—treating the body as the temple of God and showing that prudent self-care strengthens spiritual well-being and usefulness in service. So saying that caring for health is a spiritual matter best captures this view, because it places health within the context of faith and holiness rather than seeing it as merely physical, optional, or secular.

8. Which term emphasizes the authority of the Bible as the primary source for faith?

- A. Scripture**

- C. Papal authority

The main idea here is that the authority for faith rests in the Bible itself. The term Scripture signals that sacred writings are the highest source for what Christians believe and how they live, rather than human traditions or institutional authorities. In Adventist heritage, beliefs are tested against Scripture, while tradition, papal authority, and church councils are subordinate to the Bible. That focus on the Bible as the ultimate standard makes Scripture the best choice.

9. Which doctrine among the following concerns the Sabbath and the Law of God?

- A. Salvation by grace through faith
- B. Sabbath/Law of God**
- C. Spiritual gifts
- D. Conditional immortality

The idea being tested is how the Sabbath connects to God's Law. The Sabbath/Law of God doctrine treats the seventh-day Sabbath as part of the moral law given in the Ten Commandments, reflecting God's character and how humans are to relate to Him and to others. It emphasizes that the Sabbath is not a separate ritual but a weekly expression of allegiance to God—part of how believers live in obedience to His commandments, a living out of grace rather than a means of earning salvation. This perspective also sees the broader law as everlasting and binding, with the Sabbath serving as a sign of covenant loyalty within that law. The other topics listed—salvation by grace through faith, spiritual gifts, and conditional immortality—address different theological concerns (how one is saved, how the Spirit empowers believers, and beliefs about the state of the dead) and do not directly address the Sabbath in relation to the Law.

10. What was the dragon trying to do in Revelation 12 prophecy?

- A. Kill the child (Jesus)**
- B. Destroy the woman and the church
- C. Cast all believers into bondage

In Revelation 12 the dragon (symbolizing Satan) focuses on the male child who is to rule all nations—the baby Jesus. The text explicitly says the dragon stood before the woman to devour the child as soon as it was born. That describes a direct, immediate attempt to kill Jesus so that he cannot carry out his mission of salvation. This fits with the broader biblical pattern: threats to Jesus' life occur from the very infancy (Herod's slaughter of the infants) through his crucifixion, all aimed at stopping God's plan. Although the dragon's plot is foiled when the child is caught up to God's throne, the scene makes clear the intention: to destroy Jesus.
