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Explanations

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1. Which statement defines Mobility?

- A. The ability of friendly forces to react faster than the enemy.
- B. The concentration of combat power sufficient to achieve the commander's intent.

Mobility is the capability of military forces to move from place to place while retaining the ability to fulfill their primary mission. In air defense, that means a battery or radar unit can relocate to a new position to meet changing threats or survive a danger area, without losing its ability to detect, track, and engage targets. This movement capability keeps the unit effective even as the situation on the ground evolves. The idea described as reacting faster than the enemy focuses on tempo or speed of response, not on the ongoing ability to move and fight. The notion of concentrating combat power is about mass and fires, not about movement. The arrangement of forces to engage as a whole refers to deployment or positioning, not the continuous capability to relocate while maintaining mission effectiveness.

In property accountability, a DA Form 2062 hand receipt functions as the record of items assigned to a person or unit. What it typically contains is a listing of the accountable items, including descriptions, quantities, serial numbers, location, and current condition. This combination provides a complete snapshot for tracking where each item is, what exactly it is, how many there are, its serials for unique identification, where it lives or is issued, and its present state. Having only item descriptions would miss critical details needed for proper accountability, such as how many units exist, the serials that uniquely identify each item, and where and in what condition they are located. Maintenance schedules belong on separate maintenance records, not on the hand receipt itself. Vendor invoices are procurement documents and aren't part of the hand receipt's purpose, which is to track accountability for items issued and held.

Defense in depth is about layering your defenses across multiple lines so each layer slows, disrupts, and degrades an attacker, while buying time for you to react. In air defense, that means setting up forward, middle, and rear belts with overlapping sensors and fires, so if the enemy penetrates one layer, the next is ready to engage and preserve coverage. This approach creates redundancy—if one position is suppressed or bypassed, others continue to defend—so you don't rely on a single barrier. It also allows fire to be shifted from one layer to another as the situation evolves, making the defense more resilient and flexible. The other descriptions describe a single-layer defense, a rapid withdrawal, or high mobility without fixed positions, which don't capture the idea of multiple, interconnected lines of defense working together.

Receiving ADAFCO equipment requires a complete set of checks to ensure the shipment is correct, intact, and ready for inventory. Verifying the packing list against the shipment confirms that all ordered items are present and nothing is missing or mispacked. Inspecting for damage catches any harm that may have occurred in transit, so you don't accept compromised equipment. Verifying serial numbers and part numbers ensures you receive the exact items, provides essential traceability, and helps prevent misidentification or configuration errors. Signing the receiving documents provides official acknowledgment of what was received and creates a solid audit trail. Updating the inventory records then captures the new stock in the system, enabling accurate on-hand quantities and future planning. The other options only cover a single aspect (one check, a partial action, or no inventory update), so they don't provide the full, proper receiving inspection process.

THAAD is understood as part of both the Ballistic Missile Defense System and the Integrated Air Defense System. The Ballistic Missile Defense System is the overarching architecture that coordinates all ballistic-missile defense assets at the theater level, and THAAD contributes its terminal intercept capability within that broader BMDS framework. At the same time, THAAD is integrated into the theater's air defense network—the Integrated Air Defense System—which connects radars, sensors, and weapons to provide coordinated battlespace awareness and command-and-control. This combination reflects how THAAD operates not in isolation but as a component of a unified defense posture that handles both ballistic threats and air-defense integration.

The key idea is that Army air and missile defense must fit into a single, joint framework so every service can work off the same picture and command structure. The ADAFCO acts as the central integration point, making sure Army air and missile defense assets feed into the Joint Integrated Air Defense System. JIADS provides the joint architecture that fuses sensors, data, and fire control across services, delivering a unified battlespace picture and coordinated engagement capability. In practice, Army radars and batteries connect to JIADS, receive joint engagement guidance, and synchronize with Navy, Air Force, and allied systems. The other options refer to different domains (space surveillance, weather, cyber) and do not represent the joint air defense integration system.

In this sequence, every step builds on the previous one to ensure a controlled and justified response. The easiest way to remember the engagement flow is to keep the TEWA step as a formal bridge between identifying a target and actually firing. Surveil sets up overall sensor coverage, Detect confirms something merits attention, and Track/Identify locks in the target's path and who it is. Then you perform Threat Evaluation & Weapons Assignment to decide if the threat warrants engagement, which weapon(s) to use, and how to allocate them within rules of engagement. Only after that do you Engage, and finally Assess the outcome to determine if further action is needed. So the correct sequence includes that TEWA evaluation before engaging, which is why it's the best and most complete version. The other options skip TEWA, place Engage too early, or reorder steps in ways that don't reflect how the engagement decision is actually made.

In a 100% ADAFCO equipment inventory, the goal is to confirm every item's existence, identity, status, and location against what is officially recorded. You verify each item against the hand receipts to ensure the item is the one documented and that the quantity matches. You then physically count all items to establish the actual on-hand quantity. Checking serial numbers provides a unique identifier for each item, helping prevent mix-ups and ensuring correct item accountability. Verifying the condition codes ensures each item's serviceability is accurately reflected in the records. Updating the accountability system keeps the official records current with the latest counts, serial numbers, and conditions. When discrepancies arise, you report them so they can be investigated and resolved. Finally, securing items protects them from loss or tampering after verification. The other options fall short because they cover only a subset of the necessary steps. Verifying only serial numbers misses counting, condition verification, record updates, and discrepancy handling. Physically counting alone doesn't tie the results to the official records or condition statuses. Verifying items against the property book upon receipt addresses initial acquisition, not a full 100% inventory process that updates records and resolves discrepancies.

The property book is the official master record for all property the unit is accountable for, and it provides the single source of truth for what is assigned, where it is, and what condition it's in. It supports accountability and inspections by enabling quick, accurate inventories, showing each item's status from receipt through issue, maintenance, and disposition, and aligning paper records with physical assets. This comprehensive tracking is essential for audits, spot checks, and regulatory compliance, ensuring that the unit can account for every item and its location. Other choices miss the full scope: listing vendors relates to procurement data, not the asset accountability record; recording only disposal actions ignores the ongoing tracking of all assets from receipt to disposition; and tracking only calibration dates fails to capture the entire lifecycle and accountability of all accountable property.

Kill chain is the successive linkage of commanders who can authorize engagements of air and missile threats. In air defense, this chain ties together sensors, command decisions, and weapon actions, moving from threat detection and classification through appropriate authorization to engage, then execution and post-engagement assessment. Each step must pass a valid authority and confirm ROE and risk considerations to prevent misidentification or fratricide, ensuring a coordinated, timely intercept. Keep-Out Range describes a boundary or constraint for operations, not the decision flow of how an engagement is authorized. Overlapping Fires concerns how multiple fires cover a target area to increase effectiveness, not who has the authority to authorize an engagement. Resilience refers to the ability of the system to absorb, adapt, and recover from disruptions, not the chain of command for engagement authorization.
