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## **Explanations**

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### 1. Which airport uses the code DCA?

- A. Denver**

*The airport that uses the code DCA is actually in Washington, D.C., specifically Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport. This airport serves as a major hub for domestic flights and is located very close to downtown Washington, D.C., making it a convenient option for travelers heading to the capital. The other options do not correspond with the DCA code. Denver has a different airport code, which is DEN, while Atlanta's main airport, Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, is designated ATL.
