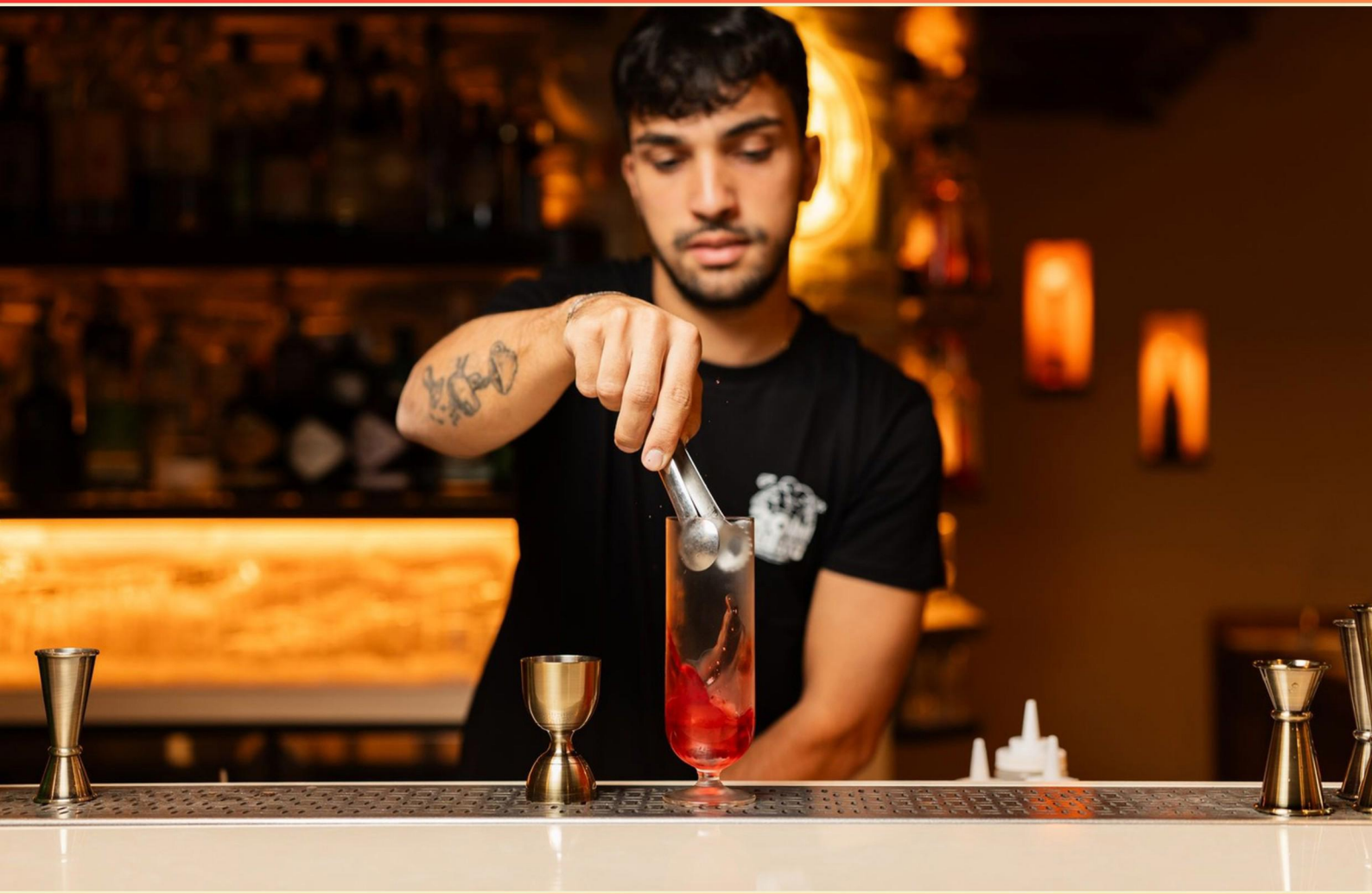

The liver is the primary organ responsible for metabolizing alcohol due to its unique enzymatic capacities and structural features.
