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Explanations

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1. Who served as the third General President of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity?

- A. Moses M. Morrison
- B. Roscoe C. Giles
- C. Frederick H. Miller

Understanding the sequence of Alpha Phi Alpha's General Presidents helps you see how the fraternity's leadership evolved as it grew. Frederick H. Miller served as the third General President, following Moses A. Morrison (the first) and Roscoe C. Giles (the second), and preceding Charles H. Garvin (the fourth). Miller's tenure sits in the early formative period when the fraternity was solidifying its national governance and supporting the expansion of chapters beyond the original group. This placement in the line of presidents is why he is identified as the third General President. The other names were the earlier or later leaders in the sequence, not the third.

2. Which of the following best describes the Go-to-High School Go-to-College program's purpose?

Preparing youth for higher education. The Go-to-High School Go-to-College program is designed to guide students from high school toward college, offering mentorship, academic support, and information about admissions, scholarships, and financial aid. Its focus is on building readiness for college and helping students navigate the steps to higher education, rather than on building athletic facilities, networking among alumni, or serving international students.

3. Who wrote the second Ritual of Alpha Phi Alpha, and what was unique about it?

The main idea here is who actually shaped the second Ritual and what set it apart. It was authored by Henry Arthur Callis and Eugene Kinckle Jones, two of the fraternity's early leaders. What makes this ritual stand out is that it was written from memory, a joint effort between the person who carried out the ritual and the person who experienced it. This reflects how the early rituals were preserved and shared through living recollection, capturing the ceremony as it was experienced and performed rather than as a prewritten script handed down later.

4. How many founders are recognized for Alpha Phi Alpha?

Seven individuals are recognized as the founders of Alpha Phi Alpha. The fraternity was founded at Cornell University in 1906 by Henry Arthur Callis, Charles Henry Chapman, Eugene Kinckle Jones, George Biddle Kelly, Nathaniel Allison Murray, Robert Harold Ogle, and Vertner Woodson Tandy. This group is traditionally known as the Seven Founders (often called the Seven Jewels). That's why seven is the correct answer. Numbers like five, nine, or eleven don't match the established founding history.

Understanding a mission statement means grasping the core purpose the organization pursues. For Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., the mission is to develop leaders, promote brotherhood and academic excellence, and provide service and advocacy for our communities. This phrasing captures the full scope: cultivating leadership, fostering unity and scholarship among members, and actively serving and advocating for the broader community. The other options describe narrower activities—fundraising, sponsoring professional sports teams, or organizing political campaigns—that aren't representative of the fraternity's defining purpose as stated.

6. How does Alpha Phi Alpha address inclusivity and non-discrimination?

- A. It enforces strict dress codes to separate members.
- B. It emphasizes academic achievement over all else.

The idea being tested is how Alpha Phi Alpha addresses inclusivity and non-discrimination. Alpha Phi Alpha promotes inclusive conduct and prohibits discrimination, harassment, and hazing, while actively fostering a respectful environment for everyone involved. This means welcoming all qualified men, supporting equal opportunity in membership, leadership, and participation, and upholding policies that clearly oppose harassment and hazing. It aligns with the fraternity's values of brotherhood, scholarship, and service, emphasizing a safe, dignified space for all members and candidates. The other options run counter to this ethos: creating separation through a dress code would undermine inclusion; prioritizing academics alone can overlook the importance of a respectful, inclusive culture; and allowing discrimination to protect tradition directly conflicts with equal treatment and respect.

7. Which document primarily governs membership requirements and chapter operations in Alpha Phi Alpha?

Membership criteria and how a chapter operates are defined by the organization's governing documents. The Fraternity Constitution and By-Laws establish who may join, the categories of membership, and the overall framework for chapter governance. The By-Laws provide the detailed rules for chapter procedures—meetings, officer roles, elections, dues, amendments, and day-to-day operations. Together, they serve as the authoritative rulebook that all members and chapters follow, across campuses and alumni networks. Campus-level codes, student-rights documents, or alumni association rules govern different scope areas—student behavior on campus, student rights, or alumni organization affairs—but they do not set the internal membership requirements or chapter operational rules for Alpha Phi Alpha.

8. When was the Fraternity officially founded?

The question tests knowing the official founding date of the Fraternity. The Fraternity was officially founded on December 4, 1906, at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York. That date is confirmed in the Fraternity's historical records, and when you check a calendar, December 4, 1906 falls on a Tuesday. So the correct choice mirrors the established founding date and the correct day of the week. The other options don't match the historical record, since they propose either a different date or a mismatched day of the week.

9. Who is the West Regional Vice President?

Understanding organizational leadership means knowing who holds each regional post. The West Regional Vice President oversees the western chapters, supports regional programs, and serves as a bridge between local chapters and the national office. In the current leadership roster, that role is filled by Dondrell Swanson, which is why this is the correct choice. The other individuals may hold different positions or serve in other regions, so they are not the West Regional Vice President.

10. How often should a chapter submit its annual report?

- A. Annually**
- B. Monthly**
- C. Biannually**
- D. Quarterly**

An annual report is meant to cover a full year, so it is submitted once each year. The word "annual" itself signals yearly frequency, not monthly, quarterly, or twice a year. Monthly or quarterly reports are used for shorter-term updates, and biannual denotes twice-yearly submissions. Since the label is specifically about a year's activities, the correct answer is once per year.
