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Explanations

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1. FA 3's PA position on the 77-300ER is in which zone and aisle?

A. Zone D, LH Aisle

B. Zone A, LH Aisle

C. Zone C, RH Aisle

D. Zone B, RH Aisle

Public Address coverage on a 777-300ER is organized by zone and side so each flight attendant has a designated mic location that can reach most of the cabin. FA 3 is positioned in the aft-left portion of the airplane, which corresponds to Zone D and the left-hand (LH) aisle. This placement gives FA 3 reliable access to announcements for the rear and mid cabin while keeping the PA pathway clear and coordinated with the other crew stations. The other zones and the right-hand aisle are designated for the other FAs, so FA 3's PA position is the aft-left zone.

2. If the 1L door is opened in ARMED mode and the slide does not inflate, where is the manual inflation handle located?

A. Top of girt, RH side

B. Bottom of door

When a slide is armed, it's ready to deploy as the door opens, but if the automatic inflation doesn't occur, you have a manual option. The manual inflation handle for the 1L door is located at the top of the girt bar, on the right-hand side of the door frame. This placement keeps the handle accessible from the cabin side and directly tied to the slide's inflation system, allowing a quick manual trigger if needed. The other suggested locations won't align with how the inflation system is designed to be operated in an ARMED configuration.

3. On the 777-300ER, FA 9 uses which jumpseat?

A. 4L

Jumpseats are fixed crew seating positions used during taxi, takeoff, and landing, and each flight attendant is assigned to a specific seat to balance the crew and optimize operations. On the 777-300ER in this operation, the Fa9 position is the left-side jumpseat in the aft galley area. This location gives quick access to the rear cabin for service or calls, while keeping the front cabin clear for passengers and allowing efficient coordination with the flight deck and other crew members. The other jumpseat locations correspond to different crew assignments, but the standard roster places Fa9 in the left aft position.

4. What are the two main functions of the Cabin Control Panel (CCP)?

The Cabin Control Panel is designed to give flight attendants centralized access to the cabin systems and to support maintenance operations. From this panel, crew can manage cabin controls such as lighting, the passenger call system, and announcements, allowing them to control the cabin environment and coordinate service. It also provides a maintenance function, enabling technicians to put systems into a maintenance mode and monitor status or perform troubleshooting without interfering with normal flight operations. Other options touch on areas that aren't the CCP's primary purpose—environmental settings (temperature and humidity) are handled by the environmental control system, while safety monitoring and separate communications functions are managed by other systems and panels. So, the two main roles align with Cabins Controls and Cabin maintenance.

5. Where should all O2 walk-arounds inside OFAR/OFCR storage space be moved to during a smoke/fire event?

- B. In the OFAR storage

In a smoke or fire event, the priority is to keep portable oxygen equipment out of the affected area while ensuring it remains readily accessible for crew use. Moving all O2 walk-arounds from OFAR/OFCR storage to the top of stairs places them away from the smoke and heat concentrated in the occupied compartments, reduces the chance of damage to the cylinders, and keeps them within reach as crews evacuate or reassess the situation. Storing them in the same OFAR/OFCR space risks exposure to the hazard; placing them in the cockpit isolates them from cabin operations and can slow deployment, and tucking them inside a PSU storage cabinet keeps them in a confined, potentially smoky area and hinders rapid access.

6. How many lavatories are onboard the 777-300ER?

The main idea being tested is knowing the total number of lavatories on a specific wide-body configuration, which matters for crew planning and passenger comfort on long-haul flights. For American Airlines' 777-300ER, the standard layout includes twelve lavatories in total. This count supports the large passenger capacity on a long-range aircraft, giving multiple lavatories across the cabin to minimize wait times and help maintain service flow. If the count were significantly lower, like eight or ten, it wouldn't match the aircraft's space and passenger load; if it were much higher, like fourteen, it would imply a different cabin setup than the standard AA configuration. So twelve is the figure that aligns with the typical 777-300ER layout used on long-haul routes.

7. How many escape ropes are listed as Flight Deck Equipment?

- A. 1

Escape ropes are part of Flight Deck Equipment to give the crew a way to evacuate from the cockpit to the outside in an emergency when doors can't be used. On the 777, there are two escape ropes listed—one for each side of the cockpit window. They're stored near the respective window escape points so the crew can quickly deploy them if needed. This ensures both sides of the cockpit have a dedicated rope for escape, which is why two is the correct count. A single rope wouldn't cover both sides, and three or four would exceed what's standard for Flight Deck Equipment.

8. On the 777-300ER, where is the manual inflation handle for 3L/3R?

- A. Top aft portion of door frame**
- B. Top of girt, RH side
- C. Bottom of door
- D. Inside cabin

The key idea is knowing where to manually inflate a slide if its automatic system doesn't deploy. For the 777-300ER doors 3L and 3R, the manual inflation handle is placed on the door frame at the top aft portion. This location gives quick, unobstructed access for a crew member standing at the door, and it positions the handle where pulling it can reliably trigger slide inflation without needing to reach into the doorway or down near the floor. Other locations described aren't the standard manual inflation point for these doors, so they wouldn't provide the intended access or function. If the slide needs to be inflated manually, you would use that top aft door-frame handle to activate the inflation mechanism.

9. Which crew member is responsible for activating the Emergency Light Switch?

- A. FA 1**
- B. Purser
- C. Captain
- D. FA 2

In an in-flight emergency, clear lighting to guide passengers to exits is essential, so there's a dedicated switch on the cabin crew control panel to activate emergency illumination. In a typical two-FA configuration, the forward flight attendant (the one assigned to the front cabin) is responsible for operating that switch. This setup lets the crew quickly illuminate the forward area and the primary exits without needing to go to the cockpit. The captain handles flight deck operations, and the purser oversees coordination, but the actual manual activation of the Emergency Light Switch is designated to the flight attendant serving the forward cabin.

10. On the 777-200, which jumpseat is assigned to FA 8?

- A. 1R
- B. 3R
- C. 3L**
- D. 4RC Outbound

Jumpseat assignments are set so crew coverage and door access are efficient for boarding, during the flight, and in an evacuation. Each flight attendant has a fixed jumpseat that matches their roster placement, ensuring the right crew member is near the appropriate exit and can coordinate with the others. For the 777-200, the left-side jumpseat in row 3 is the position designated to FA 8, which keeps them in the correct location to support left-side exits and overall cabin flow. The other options point to jumpseats in different zones or on the right side, which are assigned to different crew members and wouldn't align with FA 8's roster.
