This systematic use of parentheses aligns with the overall guidelines of APA style, which emphasizes accuracy and consistency in referencing sources.

Option D incorrectly includes "Publisher," as theses and dissertations typically do not have a traditional publisher. Each of these deficiencies highlights why option A stands out as the most accurate representation of APA style for citing theses or dissertations.

By distinguishing between low-acculturated and high-acculturated individuals, the statement acknowledges the importance of cultural and acculturation factors in psychiatric health outcomes. This differentiation is critical for a fair and accurate analysis as it recognizes that not all individuals within an ethnic group experience mental health issues in the same way, influenced by their level of integration into the larger culture. In contrast, options that do not specify the acculturation level may present a more homogenized view of ethnic groups. Without this detail, there is a risk of implying that all individuals from a specific ethnic background share the same experiences or health outcomes, which can perpetuate stereotypes and overlook the diversity within groups. Therefore, specifying the acculturation aspect in the comparison helps to mitigate bias by highlighting that mental health outcomes can vary significantly due to different cultural contexts, making the research more culturally sensitive and accurate.

In APA style, when specifying a range, the correct format is to use the word "and" instead of a hyphen to clearly convey the continuity between the two values. This ensures clarity and precision in communication. To illustrate, when presenting age ranges, one should state the range using "between" followed by the two values connected by "and," like in the correct answer option. This usage not only follows the grammatical conventions of standard English but also adheres to the APA style's emphasis on clarity and avoiding ambiguity in research writing. Therefore, the correct usage in APA style would be to communicate that participants' ages range from 2.0 and 3.5 years, ensuring readers understand the intended intervals without confusion.
