For instance, the User Manager function might imply some involvement with users, but the comprehensive and critical nature of permissions management falls squarely under the System Administrator's purview. Application Support typically deals with troubleshooting and assisting users with application issues, and a Data Analyst usually focuses on data interpretation and analysis rather than user account management. Thus, the System Administrator is clearly the most appropriate choice for this role.

The Record List View serves as a summary of multiple records, where related actions do not apply to multiple items simultaneously, hence they are not shown in that view. In contrast, the Record Details View allows users to see all pertinent details for a single record, making it appropriate for related actions that pertain to that specific entry. The Process Modeler and Start Form also do not feature related actions in the same way as they serve different purposes; the Process Modeler is for designing processes, while the Start Form is designed for initiating a process rather than managing existing records. Thus, above the Record List View is the location where related actions are not displayed.

While other options may suggest creating groups or securing them independently, starting with the All Users group provides a crucial baseline for managing security parameters effectively throughout the application.

These user types do not engage with the administrative functions that the Admin Console provides, which is why the Admin Console is primarily tailored for System Administrator type users.

Rushing to secure applications only after deployment can lead to vulnerabilities and gaps in security protocols that may be difficult to address retroactively. By prioritizing security from the start, developers can be more confident that their applications will adhere to best practices, ensuring a secure environment for users and data alike.
