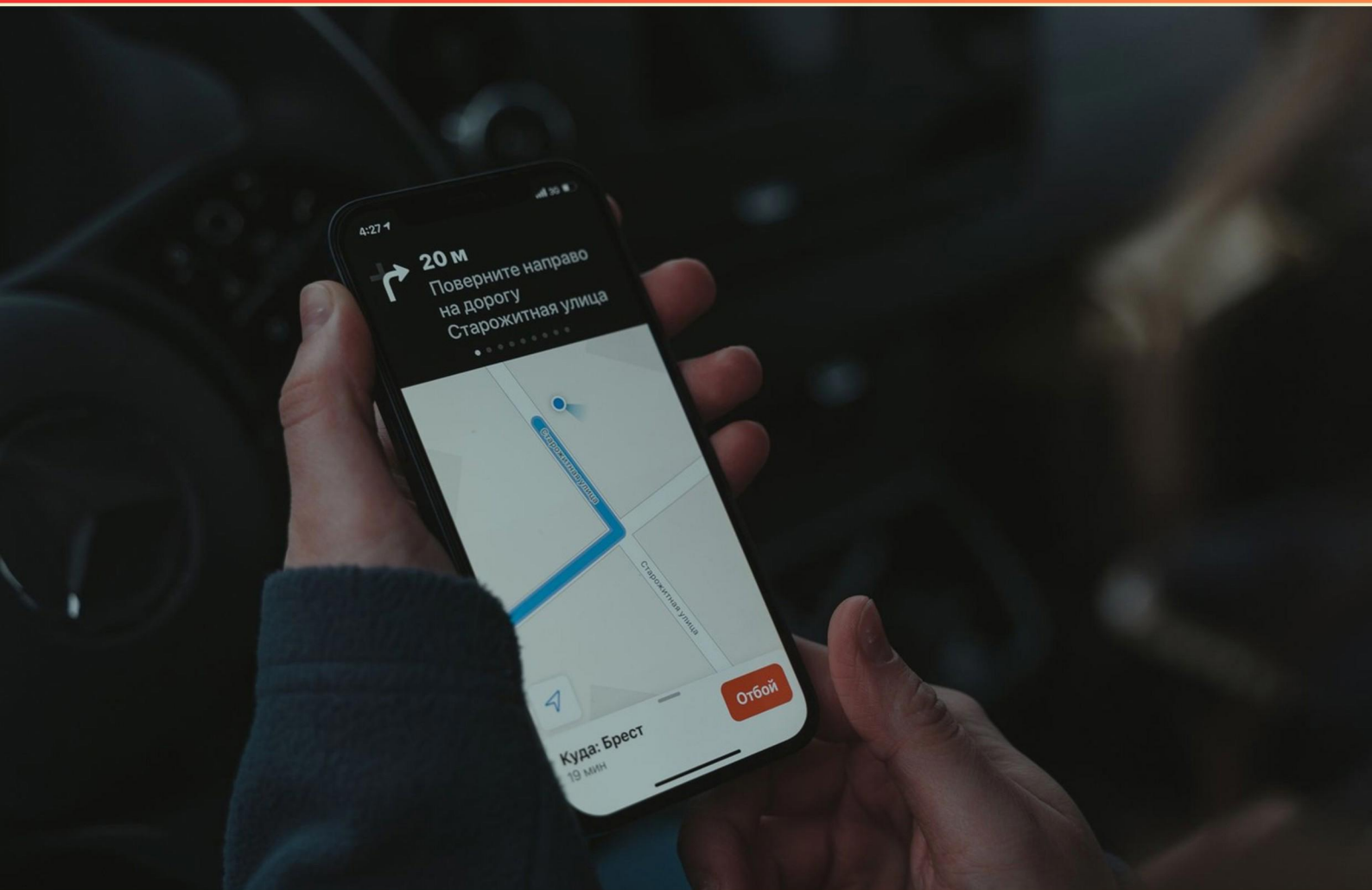

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Explanations

For example, styling basemap galleries, implementing field data collection, and creating 3D scenes are features that can be performed in both versions, though they might be executed differently. Thus, clustering is distinctly tied to the new features and advancements in Map Viewer.
