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## **Explanations**

The other choices, such as white blood cells, red blood cells, and platelets, have specific roles within the circulatory system and immune response but do not constitute the primary source of lymph. White blood cells are involved in immune defense, red blood cells are responsible for oxygen transport, and platelets play a critical role in clotting, but none of these are formed from or directly contribute to the composition of lymph like blood plasma does.

For example, requiring at least 3 years of experience would not ensure the depth of knowledge and expertise that 5 years provides. Being at least 30 years old introduces an arbitrary age limit that does not necessarily correlate with professional competence or insight. A graduate degree in cosmetology, while beneficial, is not a stipulated requirement for CTAC membership, as the focus is on practical experience rather than formal education alone. Thus, the requirement of at least 5 years of practice stands out as the most relevant and effective criterion for effective committee engagement.

Scheduled inspections would limit the ability for inspectors to observe genuine operational practices, while restricting visits to only specific times, like the beginning of the month or during appointments, could compromise the integrity of the inspections. Inspections are meant to be thorough and reflective of everyday business operations, which justifies the open timeframe for inspectors.
