The penalty can vary greatly depending on the situation, which means that the possibility of facing both a fine and jail time—as indicated in the correct answer—best describes the repercussions for this violation in Arkansas.

Similarly, the option that includes a duty to retreat at home does not align with Arkansas law, which allows for self-defense in the home without retreating. Thus, recognizing the Castle Doctrine without a duty to retreat, specifically at home, is a key aspect of Arkansas law regarding self-defense.
