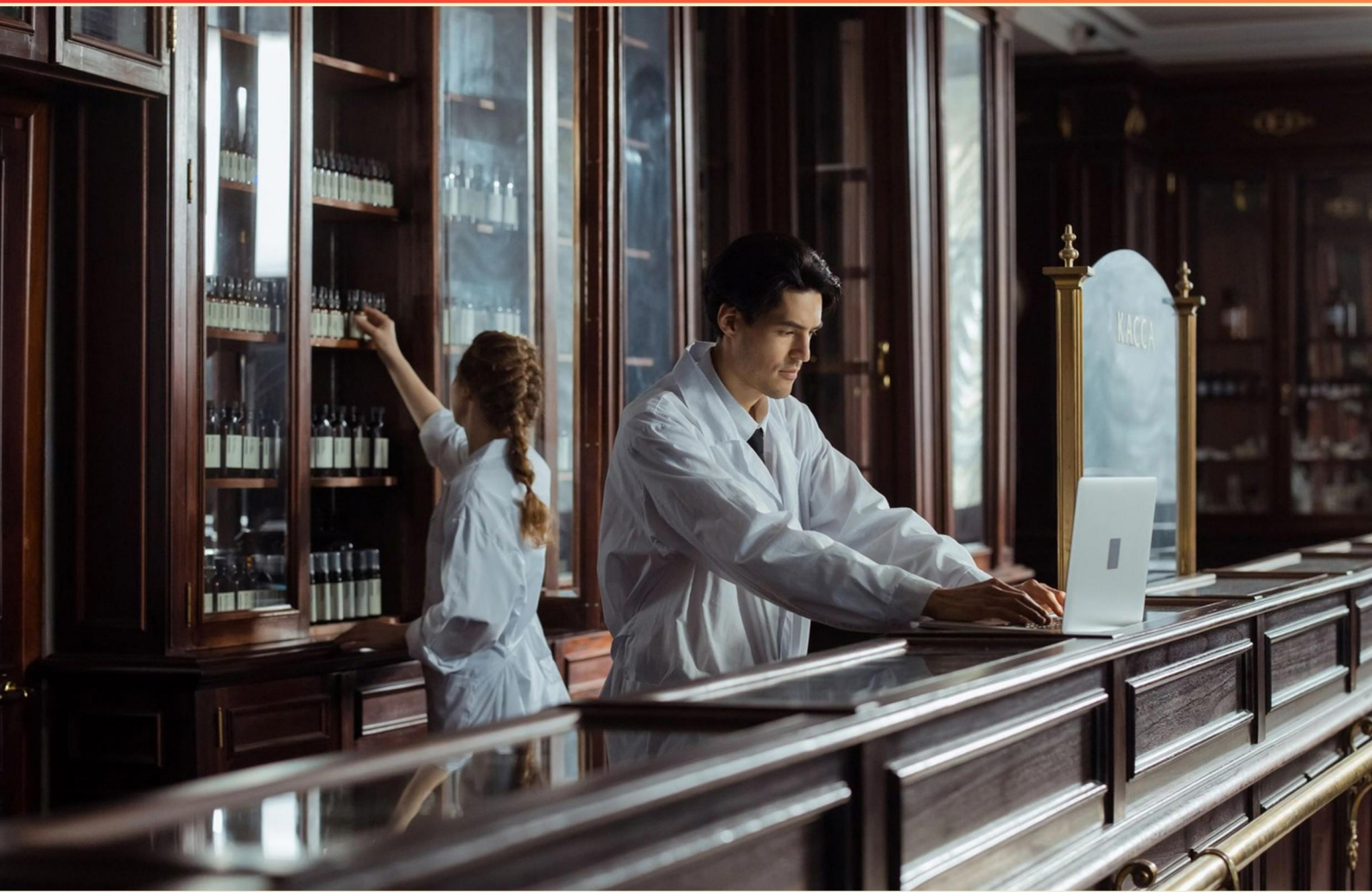

Other options present a larger ratio that exceeds the established limit, which would not ensure sufficient supervision and oversight necessary for safe pharmacy practice. By adhering to the specified ratio of a pharmacist to three technicians, Arkansas promotes a safe and efficient pharmacy environment.

10. What is the exception for nonprofit or government-funded hospitals having retail pharmacies?
