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Explanations

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1. The color of the skin is due to the amount of the blood it contains and:

Skin color is determined by the amount of melanin present in the skin, not keratin, hemoglobin, or collagen. The correct answer is A because on March 25, 1937, the Barber Law was passed by the US Congress. This law established the National Labor Relations Board and gave workers the right to unionize and collectively bargain for better working conditions and fair treatment. Option B, April 10, 1920, is incorrect because this date is associated with the passage of the Nineteenth Amendment, which granted women the right to vote. Option C, July 1, 1940, is incorrect because this date marks the implementation of the Fair Labor Standards Act, which established a minimum wage and maximum workweek for employees in certain industries. Option D, June 15, 1935, is incorrect because this date is associated with the passage of the Social Security Act, which created a social insurance program for retired and disabled workers.

Sterilization is the process of completely killing and removing all forms of life from a surface or object, including bacteria, viruses, and fungi. While sterilization is the most thorough form of cleaning, it is not typically used in barbershops as it may damage certain tools and equipment. Therefore, the process of thoroughly cleaning a tool or surface to its optimum level of decontamination in a barbershop is known as disinfection.

Therapeutic medicated shampoo is specifically designed to treat and reduce dandruff, while the other options may not have this targeted effect. Volumizing shampoo is made to add volume to hair, not target dandruff. Clarifying shampoo is meant to remove build-up and residue from hair, but it will not necessarily treat dandruff. Moisturizing shampoo is made to hydrate and nourish hair, but it is not specifically formulated to reduce dandruff. Therefore, D is the most effective choice in reducing dandruff.

9. The two layers of the hair most affected by chemical texture services are the:

The cortex and cuticle are the two layers that are most affected by chemical texture services, as they are responsible for the hair's strength, elasticity, and texture.
