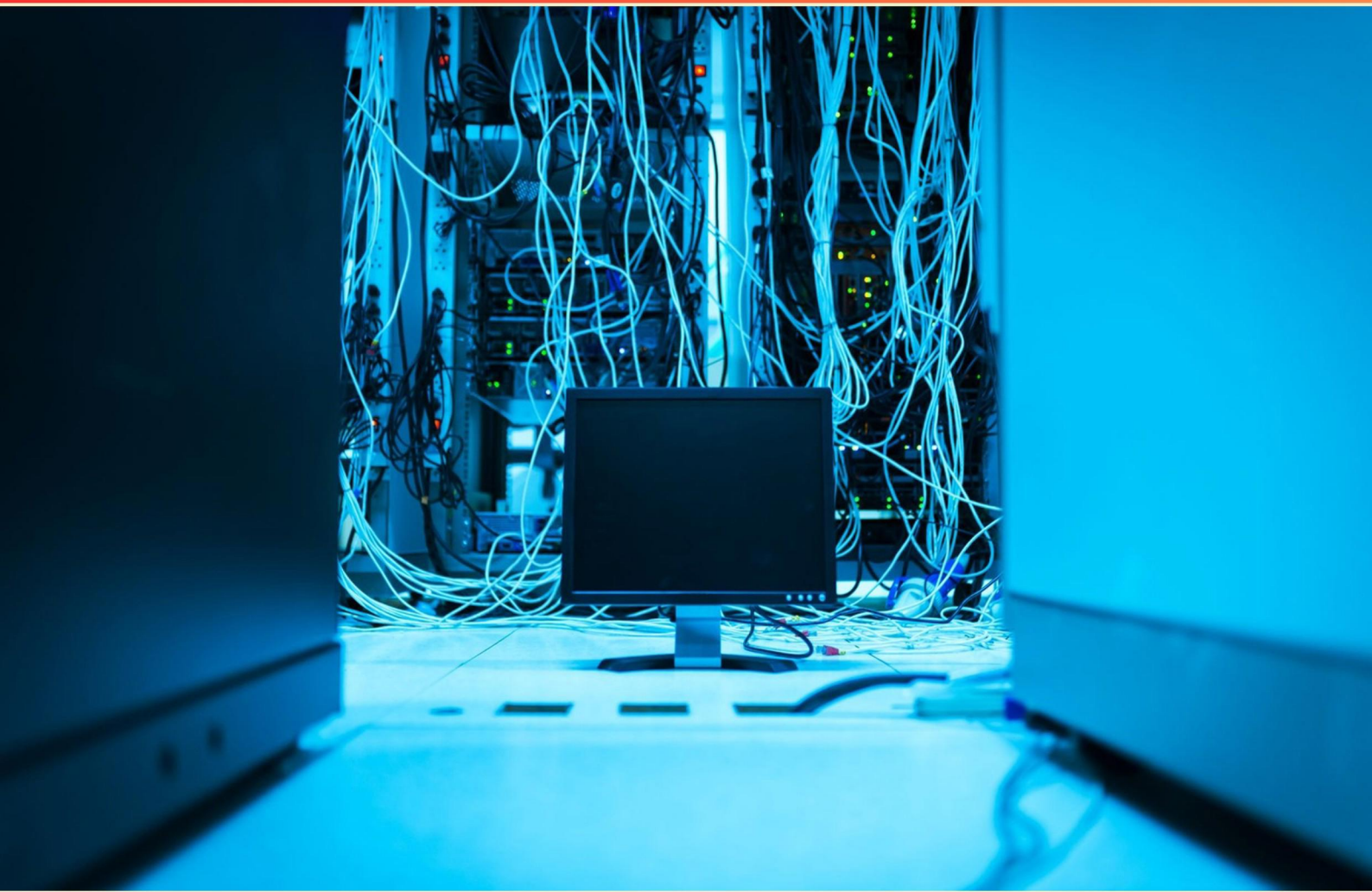

Creating machine learning algorithms pertains more to AWS services like Amazon SageMaker or AWS Lambda, which facilitate the development and deployment of machine learning models rather than video ad insertion. Managing AWS resources via PowerShell is related to AWS Tools for PowerShell, which focus on managing and automating AWS resources rather than video content monetization.

Managing user access is an administrative function that pertains more to AWS Identity and Access Management, and refunds for unused services are generally not a feature provided directly through Billing and Cost Management, as payments and refunds are subject to AWS's standard terms of service.

Amazon Glacier is primarily a low-cost cloud storage service for data archiving, not a database solution. Lastly, Amazon Redshift is a columnar data warehouse service optimized for analytics and reporting, which differs from the scalable relational database functionalities provided by RDS.

For example, database backup logs relate to data backup strategies and are not part of the compliance documentation AWS Artifact provides. Similarly, application deployment logs and user access logs pertain to operational details of applications and infrastructure rather than the compliance-related documents that AWS Artifact specifically focuses on.

Each of these services serves different purposes and does not focus on file storage and sharing in the same way WorkDocs does, highlighting why the latter is the correct answer for this question.
