Lastly, while a misdemeanor conviction can result in a permanent criminal record, the lack of acknowledged penalties makes that option misleading, as it doesn't capture the full scope of potential legal consequences faced by the person convicted.

In this way, mens rea serves as a critical factor in assessing an individual's responsibility for their actions within the legal system.
