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Explanations

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1. What does a yellow traffic light indicate?

A yellow traffic light indicates that drivers should prepare to stop if it is safe to do so. Therefore, adjusting the following distance to match increased speeds is crucial for ensuring safety on the road. Maintaining the same distant regardless of speed may not provide adequate safety, while decreasing the distance as speed increases could lead to dangerous situations where the driver cannot adequately respond to sudden changes in traffic conditions. Keeping a distance of just one car length, regardless of speed, is generally insufficient, especially at higher speeds.
