**1. Which Civil War battle had the largest number of casualties and is considered a turning point?**

- A. Battle of Antietam
- B. Battle of Fredericksburg
- C. Battle of Vicksburg
- D. Battle of Gettysburg**

*Understanding which battle qualifies as both the deadliest by total casualties and a turning point helps connect how losses shape momentum in a war. Gettysburg, fought over three days in July 1863, produced about 50,000 casualties in total, the largest toll of any Civil War battle. That huge cost, combined with its strategic outcome, marks it as a turning point: it halted Lee's invasion of the North and shifted the momentum to the Union, boosting Northern morale and signaling that Confederate hopes of winning on Northern soil were diminishing. By contrast, Antietam had the war's bloodiest single day, but the overall casualties for the battle were lower than Gettysburg, so it isn't the battle with the largest total losses. Fredericksburg was a costly Confederate victory with heavy Union losses but didn't change the war's strategic direction. Vicksburg was decisive in controlling the Mississippi and is a turning point in the Western theater, but its casualty total isn't the largest. So Gettysburg best fits both criteria: the greatest total casualties and a clear strategic turning point in the war.*

**2. Persephone, by marriage to Hades, is best described as which of the following?**

*Persephone's role comes from her marriage to Hades, which makes her Queen of the Underworld by birthright and union. As his wife, she shares in ruling the realm of the dead, a position that highlights her status within Greek myth rather than traits tied to wisdom, harvest, or the moon. The other titles belong to different figures: wisdom is associated with Athena, the harvest with Demeter, and the moon with Selene (or Artemis in other traditions). While Persephone is tied to the changing seasons through the myth of her yearly return, the clearest and strongest description of her role is as Queen of the Underworld.*

**3. Who wrote Pictures at an Exhibition?**

*This question tests your knowledge of who created Pictures at an Exhibition. Modest Mussorgsky wrote this piano suite in 1874, inspired by the paintings and drawings of Viktor Hartmann. The pieces paint musical impressions of the artworks, with a connecting Promenade motif weaving the sequence together. While the suite is famously heard in Maurice Ravel's orchestration, the original composer is Mussorgsky. The other composers listed—Beethoven, Verdi, and Holst—are known for different works and did not author this piece.*

#### 4. Who wrote *Gone with the Wind*?

*The main idea here is knowing who authored well-known novels. *Gone with the Wind* was written by Margaret Mitchell, published in 1936, and it follows life in the American South during the Civil War and Reconstruction. It earned the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction in 1937 and became a landmark work, later popularized by a famous 1939 film. The other authors listed are known for different works: Jane Austen wrote *Pride and Prejudice* and other Regency-era novels; Harper Lee wrote *To Kill a Mockingbird*; Virginia Woolf wrote modernist novels like *Mrs Dalloway*. Since Margaret Mitchell is the author associated with this novel, she is the best answer.*

#### 5. Who is described as the wife of Odin and foremost of the goddesses in Norse mythology?

- A. Idunn
- B. Hel
- C. Frigga**
- D. Freya

*In Norse mythology, Frigg is the wife of Odin and the foremost of the goddesses, often seen as the queen of the Aesir and a guardian of marriage and motherhood. She's also linked to foreknowledge, though she doesn't reveal it openly. The other names refer to different figures: Idunn tends the apples of youth, Hel rules the realm of the dead, and Freya is a major goddess of love, fertility, and war who belongs to the Vanir. Because Frigg is specifically described as Odin's wife and the leading goddess, she is the correct choice.*

#### 6. Which god is the god of the forge and fire (Greek)?

*The main idea here is identifying the Greek deity who embodies smithing, metalworking, and the use of fire. Hephaestus is the divine blacksmith of the Olympian gods, the god of fire and metalworking who forges weapons and tools in his fiery workshop. That specialization—forge and fire—is what links him directly to this role. In contrast, Zeus rules the sky and kingship among the gods, Poseidon governs the sea, and Ares personifies war. So the deity associated with forge and fire is Hephaestus.*

## 7. Who wrote Jurassic Park?

*Michael Crichton is the author who wrote Jurassic Park. He specialized in science-informed thrillers, blending real scientific ideas with gripping plots. Jurassic Park, published in 1990, follows the consequences of cloning and genetic engineering in a high-stakes setting. The other writers listed are known for very different eras and works—Geoffrey Chaucer for The Canterbury Tales in the Middle Ages, Charles Dickens for Victorian novels like Great Expectations and A Tale of Two Cities, and Daniel Defoe for Robinson Crusoe. So Crichton is the best fit because he authored this modern science fiction novel.*

## 8. Cloud Nine was written by which author?

*Cloud Nine is by a British playwright known for bending theatrical form and probing questions about gender and power. This work, first staged in 1979, is famous for its two acts set in different eras and its use of cross-casting to challenge traditional ideas about gender and sexuality. That distinctive approach and those themes are hallmarks of Caryl Churchill, making her the correct author. The other writers listed are associated with different famous plays and styles: Beaumarchais with works like The Barber of Seville, Genet with plays such as The Balcony and The Maids, and Gay with The Beggar's Opera.*

## 9. Which creature bites off Tyr's hand when he binds it?

- A. Odin
- B. Loki
- C. Ymir
- D. Fenrir

*In Norse myth, Fenrir the giant wolf is the creature whose strength the gods fear, so they bind him with a magical chain called Gleipnir. To ensure Fenrir would submit, the gods make him believe the test of the chain is fair, and they ask for a pledge of good faith. Tyr, the god of law and justice, volunteers to place his hand in Fenrir's mouth as that pledge. When Fenrir realizes the chain holds and the gods have deceived him, he bites off Tyr's hand in punishment for the deception and for binding him. So the one who bites Tyr is Fenrir.*

## 10. Who wrote the Unfinished Symphony?

A. Beethoven

B. Schubert

C. Haydn

D. Mozart

*Franz Schubert wrote the Unfinished Symphony. This nickname is tied to his Symphony No. 8 in B minor, which he began but never completed beyond two movements. The unfinished state is what makes the piece famous and is the reason people refer to it as the Unfinished Symphony. Schubert crafted it around 1822, and it gained widespread attention after his death when it was published and performed. The other composers listed are known for many completed symphonies, so their names aren't associated with this particular nickname.*
