### 1. What does this road sign mean?

- A. Railroad crossing ahead
- B. Pedestrian crossing ahead
- C. Cattle crossing ahead**
- D. Slow down ahead

This tests your ability to read warning signs about animals on the road. A sign that shows a cattle silhouette signals that cattle may be crossing ahead, so you should slow down and be prepared to stop if livestock are on or near the road. This is common in rural areas near farms or ranches, especially at dawn or dusk when cattle are more active. The sign's purpose is to alert you to a specific hazard, not just to a general slowdown. The image isn't a pedestrian crossing or a railroad crossing, and a vague "slow down ahead" wouldn't specify the risk you're about to encounter.

### 2. At a T-intersection, what does the sign mean?

- A. Left Turn Only
- B. Right Turn Only
- C. Left Or Right Turns Allowed**

At a T-intersection, the road ends ahead, so going straight isn't possible. The sign tells you which directions you may take, and in this case you may turn either to the left or to the right. That means both left and right turns are allowed, while continuing straight is not. A U-turn isn't indicated as allowed here, and would typically require its own sign. If only one turn were allowed, the sign would say left turn only or right turn only, which isn't the case.

### 3. If you approach a roundabout, always enter to the \_\_\_\_\_ of the central island.

When you approach a roundabout in right-hand traffic, you should enter on the right side of the central island. This keeps you in the proper circulating lane as you move counterclockwise around the island and allows for a smooth flow of traffic, yielding to vehicles already inside the roundabout. Staying to the right of the central island also helps prevent crossing lanes or driving into the island itself, which would be unsafe. Entering on the left or aiming for the center would require improper maneuvers and could lead to conflicts with other vehicles. So the correct approach is to enter to the right of the central island.

**4. What is the purpose of acceleration ramps on freeways?**

- A. To stop vehicles on ramp
- B. To reach freeway speed to merge**

Acceleration ramps are there to give you the space and time to bring your speed up to the level of freeway traffic so you can merge smoothly. The idea is to reach highway speed in the ramp and merge into the flow without abrupt braking or weaving, reducing the risk for you and other drivers. If you can't reach the needed speed or find a gap, you should adjust your approach—signal, check traffic, and merge when it's safe. Stopping on the ramp would cause a hazard, rest areas are for breaks away from the roadway, and exiting the highway uses dedicated exit ramps, not the acceleration ramp.

**5. You are turning a corner and there are no other vehicles around. Do you still need to use your turn signal?**

Indicating your intention is essential for safe and predictable driving. When you turn a corner, you should use your turn signal to communicate where you're headed, even if the road ahead is empty. The signal gives pedestrians who might be stepping into the street and any approaching drivers or cyclists time to notice and react, reducing surprises and helping everyone stay safe. This is a standard practice and is typically required by law for turning maneuvers. So, always indicate before you turn, giving others a clear heads-up for your move.

**6. If your parked car rolls away and hits another vehicle, what should you do?**

- A. Leave a note with your name, phone number, and address and securely attach it to the vehicle or property you hit. Report the collision to the city police.**

Stopping after causing damage to another vehicle is a legal obligation. The right approach is to leave your contact information on the damaged vehicle or property and to report the incident to the local police. This ensures the other party can reach you, creates an official record, and helps with insurance claims and liability. Driving away, waiting for the owner to contact you, or doing nothing can be treated as a hit-and-run and is generally illegal, exposing you to serious consequences. If you can't locate the owner, still notify the police and then follow up with your insurer.

This sign warns you that you're on a two-way roadway, where traffic moves toward you and away from you in opposite directions. Knowing this helps you stay in your lane, watch for oncoming vehicles, and be extra careful when turning or passing since cars can appear from the opposite direction. It's different from a one-way street, where traffic only travels in one direction, a divided highway, which has a physical separation between opposing directions, and a pedestrian zone, where vehicle access is restricted.

**8. A white letter sign typically indicates which type of roadway sign?**

- A. Service/guide sign**
- B. Warning sign**

White lettering on a blue background identifies service or guide information. This color combination is used for signs that point you to facilities and destinations—gas, food, lodging, hospitals, rest areas, or directions to cities—helping you plan where to stop or how to reach a place. Other sign types use different colors: construction signs are orange, warning signs are yellow, and regulatory signs are white with black text. So the sign with white letters on blue is a service/guide sign.

**9. U-turns are not legal in which of the following areas?**

U-turns are not legal on a one-way street because traffic moves in only one direction. Turning around would require you to go the wrong way or cross opposing traffic, which creates a serious safety risk and is prohibited by law. In contrast, on other road types, a U-turn may be allowed at intersections or designated openings if there are no signs restricting it, so those situations aren't universally forbidden. That's why the one-way street is the correct choice.

**10. During a turn, the path traced by the rear wheels is typically longer or shorter than the front wheels.**

**A. Longer**

**B. The same**

When a car turns, each wheel follows a circular path around the turn's center. The distance a wheel travels depends on how far its path is from that center. The front wheels are steered toward the center and, especially the outer front wheel, sit farther from the turn center than the rear wheels. The rear wheels stay closer to the center and thus trace a shorter arc. So the path traced by the rear wheels is shorter than the path traced by the front wheels.
