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Explanations

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1. Which city is associated with code DTW?

- A. Detroit, Michigan**
- B. Houston, Texas**

DTW is the IATA airport code for Detroit. IATA codes are the three-letter identifiers used worldwide to name airports in tickets and schedules. The Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport serves Detroit, Michigan, which is why the code DTW is linked to that city. The other options correspond to different places: Houston's major airports use codes like IAH or HOU, Hartford/Springfield is associated with Bradley International (BDL), and Martha's Vineyard has MVY. So, Detroit, Michigan is the city associated with DTW.

2. Which IATA code corresponds to Presque Isle Northern Maine Airport?

IATA airport codes are three-letter identifiers that map to a specific airport and the city it serves. ANU designates V. C. Bird International Airport near St. John's in Antigua and Barbuda, so the city commonly associated with ANU is Antigua. The other locations have different codes—St. Maarten is SXM, Cancun is CUN, and Providenciales is PLS—so they don't match ANU.
