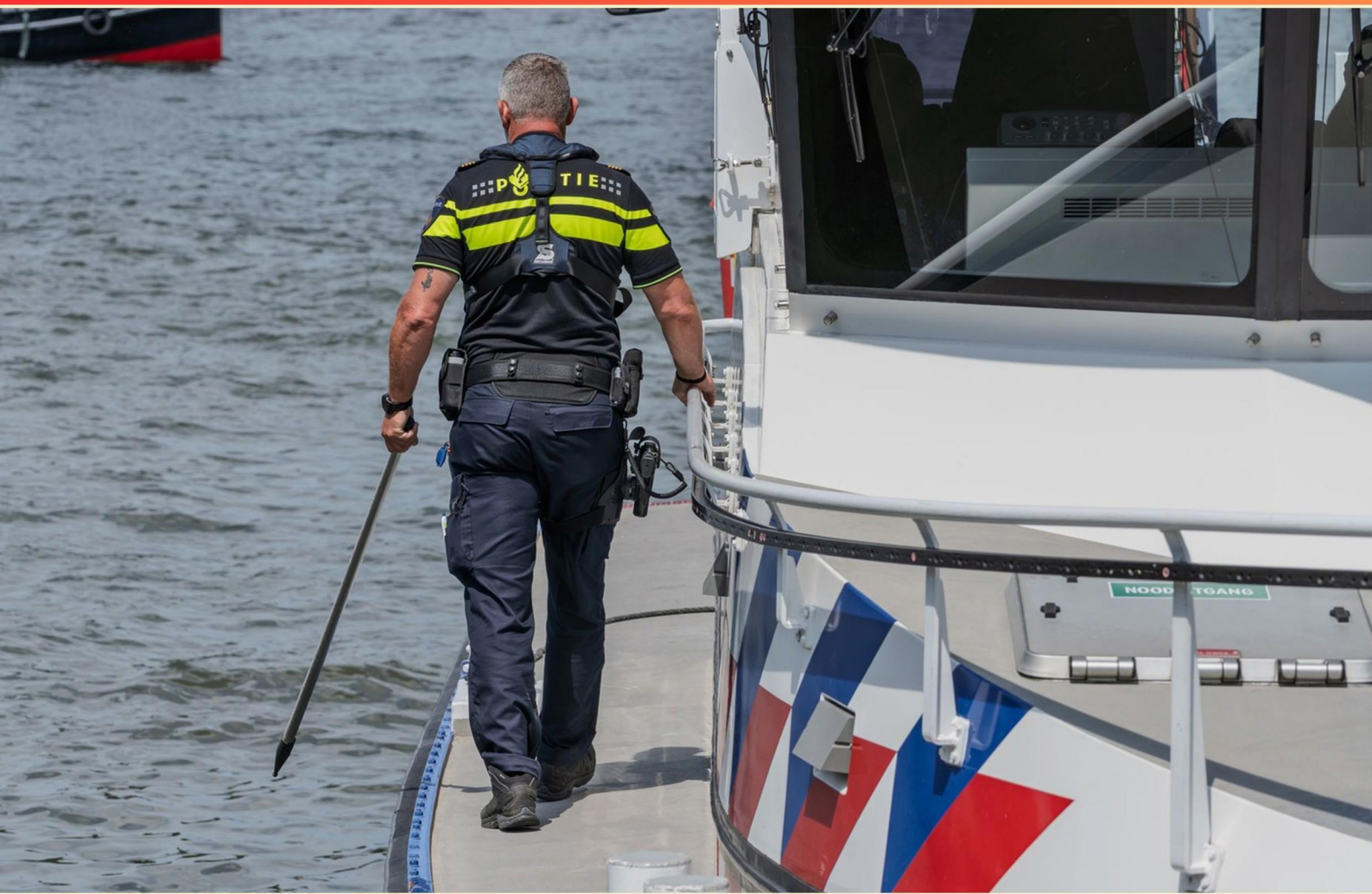

Understanding the implications of this law highlights the urgency and efficiency with which certain inadmissible individuals can be processed under U.S. immigration policy.*
