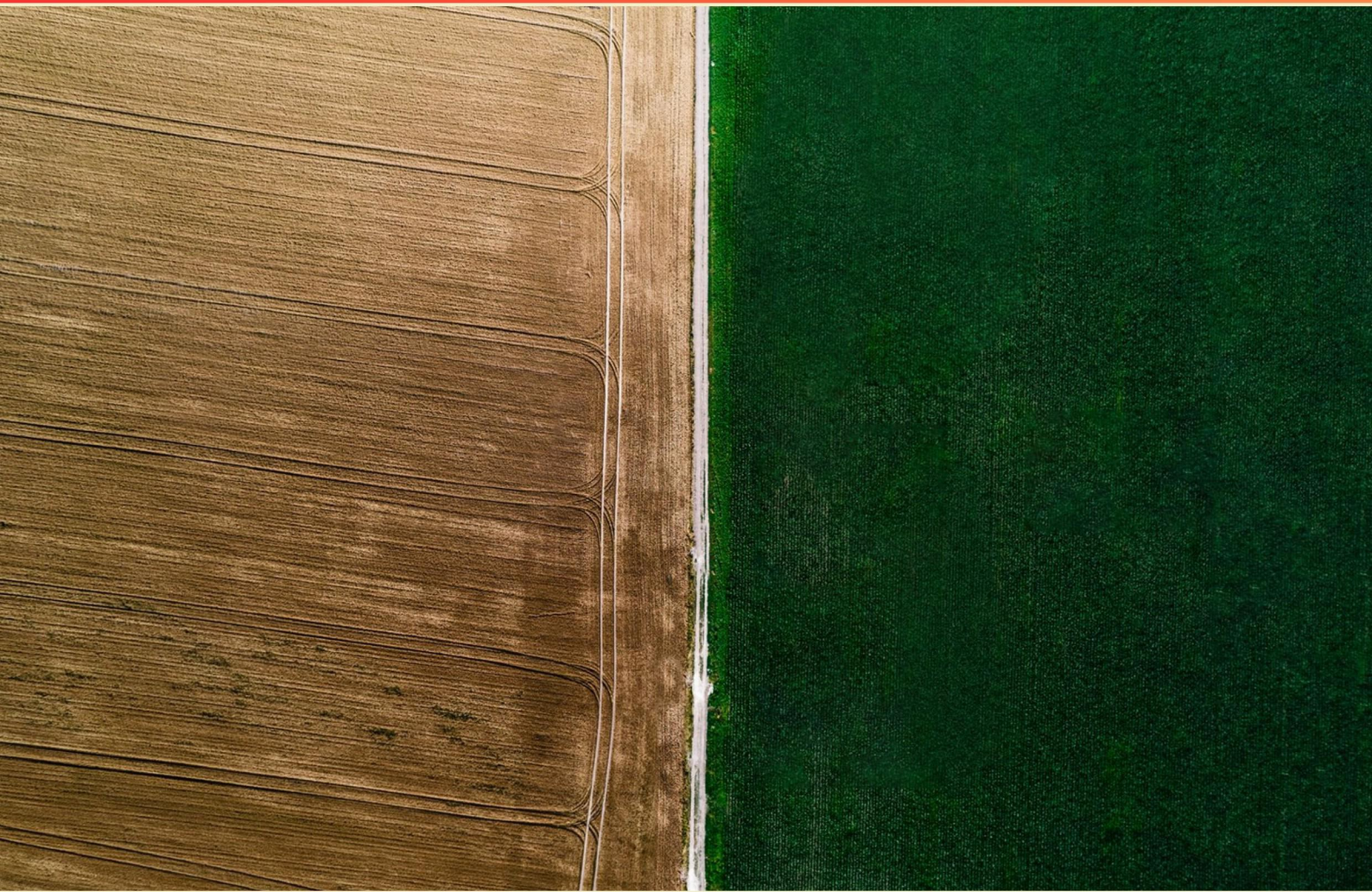

Therefore, LPR stands out as the most appropriate technology for vehicle inspection.

Open questions encourage elaboration, giving the interviewee the opportunity to provide detailed information. Direct questions can prompt specific answers, which is valuable in certain contexts. However, the clarity and focus that compound questions lack makes them particularly problematic for effective information gathering during interviews.

This standard is crucial because it safeguards individuals' rights against arbitrary searches and seizures by ensuring that there is a legal basis for such actions. A vehicle search without these requirements could lead to evidence being deemed inadmissible in court due to violation of the suspect's constitutional rights. Various other answers, such as reasonable suspicion or random checkpoints, do not meet the necessary legal benchmarks established in this ruling for a legitimate search to be conducted while maintaining compliance with constitutional protections.

This system is critical for various applications, including GPS technology and geographic information systems (GIS). Understanding longitude allows for more accurate travel and better understanding of global relations between different locations.
