In contrast, medications for headaches typically include analgesics or anti-inflammatory drugs, whereas high blood pressure is usually managed with antihypertensives or diuretics, and cholesterol levels are addressed with statins or other lipid-lowering agents. Therefore, Zantac's primary indication and function clearly align with treating acid reflux.
