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## **Explanations**

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**1. Which date is the earliest among the official service birthdays?**

- A. 4 August 1790**
- B. 10 November 1775**
- C. 18 September 1947**
- D. 20 December 2019**

Official service birthdays are the dates when each military branch was established. Among the options, November 10, 1775 is the earliest because it marks the formation of the Continental Army by the Continental Congress, widely recognized as the Army's birthday. The other dates occur later: August 4, 1790 is after 1775, September 18, 1947 is the Air Force's birthday as a separate branch, and December 20, 2019 is a recent date with no service birthday significance. Therefore, the earliest date is November 10, 1775.

**2. Who is the Vice Group Commander?**

The Vice Group Commander is the deputy to the Group Commander, helping run operations, training, and events and stepping in when the Group Commander is unavailable. A Major is a senior cadet officer, well-suited for this deputy role because it requires leadership experience and the ability to oversee cadet activities across the unit. In this case, Maj Sanmit Gaikwad holds that position, so he is the best answer. The other individuals align with other roles or ranks, which is why they aren't the Vice Group Commander in this context.

**3. What is the movement of Left Face?**

- A. Turn 180 degrees in place with feet together.**
- B. Pivot 90 degrees on your right heel and ball of the left foot, keeping your legs straight. On the 2nd count bring the left heel smartly to the right heel.**
- C. Pivot 90 degrees on your left heel and ball of the right foot, keeping your legs straight. On the 2nd count bring the left heel smartly to the right heel.**
- D. Stand still and rotate torso only.**

Left Face is a 90-degree turn to the left performed as a controlled pivot. The left heel remains planted as the pivot point while the body rotates, using the ball of the right foot to assist the turn with legs kept straight. On the second count, the left heel snaps forward to meet the right heel, completing the turn and bringing you to face the left direction. This approach ensures a clean, aligned change of facing rather than a full 180-degree turn or just twisting the torso.

**4. Which rank corresponds to pay grade E-5?**

- A. Technical Sergeant (TSgt)**
- B. Master Sergeant (MSgt)**
- C. Senior Master Sergeant (SMSgt)**
- D. Staff Sergeant (SSgt)**

Enlisted pay grades map to specific ranks, and in the Air Force, E-5 corresponds to Staff Sergeant. This rank sits between Senior Airman (E-4) and Technical Sergeant (E-6), so it's the exact match for E-5. The other options are higher pay grades—Technical Sergeant is E-6, Master Sergeant is E-7, and Senior Master Sergeant is E-8—so they don't fit E-5.

**5. Which role corresponds to c/TSgt Craig Jennings?**

- A. Unarmed Drill Team NCO**
- B. Color Guard Commander**
- C. Honor Guard NCO**
- D. Rifle Team Commander**

Color guard duties center on the correct handling and presentation of the national colors during ceremonies, requiring precise drill movements, steady bearing, and synchronized timing with the rest of the event. A cadet at the technical sergeant level is well-suited to lead this team because the rank carries enough leadership experience to supervise a color guard, ensure each member knows their position and movements, and maintain uniform standards throughout the performance. This role focuses on ceremonial bearing and proper color presentation, which is why it fits best for a c/TSgt. The other roles involve different ceremonial or drill focuses: an unarmed drill team NCO leads drill routines without colors, an honor guard NCO handles specific honor guard duties, and a rifle team commander leads the rifle team in related drills or ceremonies. These are distinct from the color guard mission, which is specifically about colors presentation.

**6. If you see the abbreviation TSgt, what is the full rank name?**

- A. Technical Sergeant**
- B. Staff Sergeant**

Understanding how Air Force enlisted ranks are abbreviated helps you read the tags quickly. TSgt stands for Technical Sergeant, the E-6 rank. The "Sgt" shows the sergeant line, while the prefix "Tech" signals a technician-focused supervisory role. This rank sits above Staff Sergeant (E-5) and below Master Sergeant (E-7).

## 7. Who is the CMSGT?

The main idea is identifying the senior enlisted leader in a JROTC unit. The CMSGT stands for Command Chief Master Sergeant, the top enlisted cadet who advises the Cadet Wing Commander, helps supervise enlisted cadets, and ensures standards in drill, uniforms, and training. In the roster used for this item, Francesca Gomez is designated as the CMSGT, so she is the correct choice. The other names may hold other leadership roles, but they are not the CMSGT in this context.

## 8. Who is the Local Congressman?

- A. The Honorable George T. Whitesides**
- B. The Honorable Ted Lieu
- C. The Honorable Eric Swalwell
- D. The Honorable Adam Schiff

Locating your Local Congressman means identifying who currently represents your congressional district in the U.S. House of Representatives, and you address that person as The Honorable. This question asks for the individual who fills that seat for the described locality. The option naming The Honorable George T. Whitesides is presented as the person holding that office in this scenario, so it is the best choice within the context of the item. The other names listed are also figures who have held or hold public office, but they do not match the local district described here. If you need to know who currently holds the seat, check the official government roster for the latest representative.

## 9. Which statement best reflects the program's goals?

- A. To Promote Competitive Sports Among Cadets
- B. To instill values of citizenship, service to the United States, personal responsibility, and a sense of accomplishment in high school students.**
- C. To Prepare Cadets For Combat
- D. To Develop Advanced Rocket Engineering Skills

The main idea being tested is the program's purpose in shaping students into responsible, engaged citizens and leaders. The statement that emphasizes instilling values of citizenship, service to the United States, personal responsibility, and a sense of accomplishment in high school students directly reflects that mission. It highlights character development, leadership, and a commitment to community and country, which are at the heart of the program. The other descriptions miss the mark because they shift the focus away from character and leadership toward athletics, combat preparedness, or technical specialization. Competitive sports emphasize sports rather than citizenship and leadership; preparing cadets for combat contradicts the program's educational, noncombat aim; and advanced rocket engineering skills go beyond the program's scope of developing well-rounded, community-minded leaders.

## 10. Who is the Tango Team NCO?

An NCO in charge leads the team, trains members, and keeps drill and performance standards running smoothly under an officer's guidance. For a hands-on, day-to-day leadership role like the Tango Team NCO, a mid-level NCO who can mentor others is the best fit. Miley Arrington holds the rank of Technical Sergeant, which is exactly that level of leadership and instructional capability. The other options include an officer, an entry-level Airman, and a higher-ranking NCO, none of which align with the typical NCO-in-charge role for a specific team. So Miley Arrington is the Tango Team NCO.
