The emphasis here is on accountability and satisfying societal demands for justice rather than on helping the inmate transform. The distinction underscores that rehabilitation is not simply about serving time but is a proactive process aimed at fostering change and preventing future crime. Thus, the essence of rehabilitation involves preparing inmates not just to serve their sentences but to lead productive lives post-incarceration, which makes this choice the most accurate representation of the differences between rehabilitation and punishment within correctional systems.
