Allowing any size or voltage of lights in all areas could lead to over-harvesting or unethical hunting methods. High-powered lights in open fields could also have an adverse impact on wildlife. Lastly, a blanket prohibition against using any lights after dark would eliminate all visibility and safety measures for hunters, thereby making it impractical and unsafe for nighttime hunting.
