Thus, the recognition of conventions is crucial for both the creation and comprehension of literary works.

Another choice focuses on connecting two independent clauses, which relates to conjunctions. Lastly, modifying a noun pertains to adjectives, which describe or modify nouns. Hence, these definitions do not capture the essence of what defines a verb.
