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Explanations

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1. After notice of sale, what action does the department take?

- A. Transfers title to the purchaser
- B. Marks its records and notifies persons with proprietary interest that title will not transfer until lien is satisfied**
- C. Delays the sale for 60 days

When there's a notice of sale, the department updates its records and informs anyone with a proprietary interest that the title will not transfer until the lien is satisfied. This protects the security interests tied to the vessel and ensures that a buyer does not obtain clear title while a lien remains unpaid. It also gives lienholders notice so they can act to protect their lien. The title transfer to the purchaser only occurs after the lien is resolved; transfers aren't made while the lien exists, and the lien isn't voided by the sale.

2. What is the basic method for determining position on a chart when you have a landmark bearing?

- A. Use depth soundings to triangulate.

When you know a bearing to a landmark, you plot a line of position on the chart from that landmark along the observed bearing. Your vessel's position lies somewhere along that line. To fix your exact spot, you need a second line of position from another landmark or a known fix. Plot the second line the same way, and where the two lines cross is your precise position. This use of intersecting lines of position is the fundamental method for determining your location from landmark bearings. With only one bearing you only get a line, not a unique point.

3. If a hearing is desired, what must occur?

- A. Declaration of opposition within 15 days of mailed notice.**

When you want a hearing, you must act quickly by filing a declaration of opposition within 15 days after the notice is mailed. The clock starts on the mailing date, not when you happen to see the notice, so it's important to check mail promptly. This short window is set to preserve your right to a hearing while keeping the process moving for the agency. If you miss that deadline, the agency can proceed without a hearing, and the decision may become final. A proper declaration should be directed to the correct office and include your identifying information and a clear statement that you want a hearing. Longer timeframes, like 30 or 60 days, aren't the correct process here, and claiming no declaration is required would bypass the hearing right when it's actually being sought.

4. Owner declines consent to storage; what must occur before the vessel can remain?

- A. The owner must satisfy the lien and remove the vessel.**

A storage lien on a vessel is the claim a storage operator has to secure payment of storage charges. If the owner doesn't consent to storage, the vessel can stay only after those charges are paid and the lien is satisfied. Paying the lien releases the vessel from the storage hold, allowing it to be removed or reclaimed. If the lien isn't satisfied, the storage holder can keep the vessel or pursue enforcement to recover the debt. The lien isn't automatically canceled, and authorities don't have to seize the vessel as the immediate step. So, the owner must pay the storage charges (satisfy the lien) and then remove the vessel.

5. An Authorization to Sell must contain which items?

- A. Description, make, undoc. vessel registration number and name, official number, and home port if USCG documented.**

Vessel identification and documentation status must be clearly specified in an Authorization to Sell. This form should provide enough details to uniquely identify the boat and confirm the person has authority to sell it. Including a description and make helps you distinguish the hull, while the undoc. vessel registration number and the vessel's name identify boats that aren't USCG-documented. For USCG-documented vessels, the official number is the unique identifier assigned by the Coast Guard, and the home port ties to the vessel's documentation. Together, these items ensure there's no confusion about which boat is being sold and who is authorized to sell it. Price, buyer's signature, or insurance policy numbers do not establish authority or identify the vessel, so they aren't appropriate elements for the authorization.

6. When a department receives a declaration of opposition, what is the result?

When a declaration of opposition is received, the lien sale is put on hold. The department must not conduct the sale until the lienholder files a court action within 20 days of notice, and either the court issues a judgment in favor of the lienholder or the declarant releases the interest. This requirement ensures the contested claim gets a judicial resolution before any sale takes place. If the lienholder timely files and prevails, the sale can proceed with the lien in place; if they don't file in time or don't prevail, the sale can proceed (or the declarant may release the interest). The other outcomes—proceeding without delay, forfeiture to the state, or automatic removal of the lien—do not reflect this hold-and-resolve process.

7. Do internal combustion engines located under the gunwale require a backfire flame arrestor?

Backfire flame arrestors protect the intake from a backfired flame. Any spark-ignition internal combustion engine that draws air through an intake can experience a backfire, which could flash into the carburetor or fuel-air mixture and ignite vapors in the engine space. Location under the gunwale doesn't remove that risk, so a flame arrestor is required for these engines. Diesel engines don't have the same backfire risk through a carburetor, but the rule in this context focuses on spark-ignition engines, hence the requirement applies.

8. Return of declaration of opposition constitutes what?

- A. Consent to service of legal process**

The main idea is that returning a declaration of opposition signals consent to receive legal documents and participate in the case. By filing and then returning this declaration, you're saying you accept service of process, so the court and opposing party can serve you with papers (often by mail or as otherwise specified). This helps ensure due process, since you're acknowledging you'll be contacted and can respond. It's not about releasing a lien, automatically triggering a hearing, or transferring title—the declaration's return is a procedural step related to service and participation in the suit.

9. Where are all fees paid to the department deposited?

- A. State Treasury into Harbors and Watercraft Revolving Fund.**
- B. Broker's personal account.
- C. Escrow account.

Fees collected by the department go into the State Treasury, specifically into the Harbors and Watercraft Revolving Fund. This creates a dedicated funding source for harbor and watercraft programs, so the revenues from these fees are available to support operations, safety, maintenance, and capital projects related to harbors and waterways. Keeping funds in a state revolving fund within the treasury ensures proper accounting and that the money is used for its intended purposes. Depositing into a broker's personal account would be improper, an escrow account is used for private real estate transactions, and the Federal Treasury is for federal government receipts, not state agencies.

10. What happens to the exam fee if a temporary licensee fails to appear for the written exam?

- A. The exam fee is forfeited.**

When you miss a scheduled written exam, the exam fee is forfeited. The fee covers the costs of administering that specific sitting—securing a seat, proctoring, and processing materials. If you don't show up, those resources aren't used, and the policy is to keep the fee rather than refund it. If you need another attempt, you'll typically have to pay a new exam fee to re-register.
