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Explanations

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1. As of 2008, NAFTA covered over _____ people and over \$_____ in merchandise trade.

- A. 300 million people and \$500 billion
- B. 444 million people and \$1 trillion**

NAFTA, or the North American Free Trade Agreement, is a trilateral trade agreement between the United States, Canada, and Mexico that went into effect in 1994. As of 2008, it was estimated that NAFTA covered approximately 444 million people and over \$1 trillion in merchandise trade. Option A is incorrect because the population of the three countries combined was already over 300 million in 1994 when NAFTA began, making it highly unlikely that the population covered by the agreement would have remained the same for over a decade. Option C is incorrect because the combined population of the three countries in 2008 was still under 500 million, and \$1.5 trillion is an overestimation of the total merchandise trade value. Option D is incorrect because the population of the three countries combined in 2008 was closer to 350 million, making it unlikely that over 250 million people would be directly impacted by NAFTA. Therefore, option B is the most accurate choice, as it falls within a reasonable range for both population and trade values covered by NAFTA in 2008.

2. Sir Frederick Banting of Toronto and Charles Best discovered which hormone?

Sir Frederick Banting and Charles Best discovered insulin. Adrenaline, estrogen, and cortisol were all discovered by different scientists and are not correct in this context. Adrenaline was discovered by Japanese chemist Jokichi Takamine, Estrogen was discovered by German chemist Adolf Butenandt, and cortisol was discovered by Hungarian biochemist Tadeus Reichstein.

3. What is another name for the Great Depression?

The Great Depression is often referred to as the "Dirty Thirties" because it was a time of widespread economic downturn and poverty in the 1930s. Many people lost their jobs, homes, and savings, and were forced to live in makeshift settlements known as "Hoovervilles." The other options may also describe events or aspects of the Great Depression, but "Dirty Thirties" is the most commonly used alternative name. Option A, "The Big Crash," may refer to the stock market crash of 1929 that triggered the Great Depression, but does not encompass the entire period. Option B, "Black Tuesday," is also a term used to describe the stock market crash, specifically on October 29, 1929. Option C, "The Economic Downturn," is a broad term that can describe any period of economic decline, but does not specifically refer to the Great Depression.

In 1994, Mexico joined the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). Option A is incorrect as Mexico first expressed interest in joining NAFTA in 1990, not 1988. Option B is incorrect as this was the year Canada and the United States finalized the agreement and Mexico was not yet involved. Option D is incorrect as it was three years after Mexico became a NAFTA partner.

5. How is Louis Riel remembered in Canadian history?

Louis Riel is remembered in Canadian history as a hero and Father of Manitoba, as he played a crucial role in the formation of the province. Despite being initially seen as a rebel by the Canadian government, Riel fought for the rights and recognition of the Métis people, who were often marginalized and mistreated. This led to him being viewed as a hero by many, particularly in Manitoba, where he is still widely celebrated. Option A is incorrect because, while some may view Riel as a villain due to his involvement in rebellions, this is not the overall consensus. Option C is also incorrect, as Riel's actions were in opposition to British control. Option D is also incorrect, as Riel was not the first Prime Minister of Canada, but rather a political leader in the Red River Resistance and North-West Rebellion.

The Prime Minister is the leader of the federal government and is responsible for making major decisions and leading the country. In contrast, the Commissioner is a representative of the federal government who has a more ceremonial role and acts as a link between the federal government and the territories, rather than having significant political power. Therefore, the correct answer is C.

7. What is the origin of Canada's name?

- A. From the word 'kanata' meaning 'village'**

Canada's name comes from the word 'kanata', a term used by the Indigenous inhabitants of the land which means 'village'. This was the first recorded use of the word to describe the land by French explorer Jacques Cartier in the 16th century. Option B is incorrect as the word 'canada' does not have Latin origins and there is no evidence to suggest that the name originates from there. Option C is incorrect as Canada was already named by the time John Cabot arrived, and option D is incorrect as there is no connection between the French word 'cane' and the name of Canada.

8. What are the two levels of government created by the Fathers of Confederation?

After the Confederation of Canada in 1867, the Fathers of Confederation established a two-level system of government federal and provincial. The federal government is responsible for national issues such as defense, international affairs, and trade, while the provincial governments have jurisdiction over matters such as education, healthcare, and natural resources. The other options, such as B and D, contain one correct level of government but do not include the second level. Option A, municipal and provincial, is incorrect as the municipal level of government is created by the provincial government rather than the Fathers of Confederation. Option D is incorrect as territories were not created by the Fathers of Confederation but instead were later added to Canada as new provinces. Therefore, option C, federal and provincial, is the most accurate answer.

9. True or False: A large percentage of Canada's exports are natural resources commodities.

- A. True**
- B. False

Natural resources such as lumber, oil, minerals, and agricultural products play a significant role in Canada's economy. Therefore, it is true that a large percentage of Canada's exports are natural resource commodities. Option B is incorrect because Canada is known for its abundance of natural resources and is one of the top countries in the world for exporting these commodities. Therefore, it would be illogical to say that a small percentage of Canada's exports are natural resources. Based on this information, the correct answer is A.

10. What percent of the population speak Chinese at home in Vancouver?

- A. 5%
- B. 9%
- C. 13%**
- D. 20%

Option A (5%) is incorrect because it is too low; Vancouver has a significant Chinese population. Option B (9%) is incorrect because it is still too low; there are many Chinese-speaking people in Vancouver. Option D (20%) is incorrect because it is too high; although Vancouver has a large Chinese population, it is not that high. Therefore, option C (13%) is the most reasonable answer as it is a more accurate representation of the percentage of the population that speaks Chinese at home in Vancouver.
