The Estimating (EST) practice area is closely related to the Planning practice area because estimation is a foundational component of effective project planning. While the Performance Management, Quality Assurance, and Supplier Management practices may touch on aspects of estimating in their processes, they do not share the same direct link with the EST practice area as Planning does. Performance Management focuses more on evaluating and measuring project performance, Quality Assurance centers on ensuring the processes and products meet certain standards, and Supplier Management deals with overseeing supplier relationships and contracts. These areas, while important, do not rely as fundamentally on estimation techniques as Planning does.

In contrast, developing software tools, managing day-to-day operations, and conducting user training are important activities, but they primarily fall within different areas of responsibility, such as technical execution, operational management, and training and development, rather than the high-level governance function that defines and directs the strategic priorities of the organization.

Understanding this categorization underscores the importance of hands-on engagement in quality assurance and highlights the operational nature of the Ensuring Quality Capability Area within CMMI, where success is realized through direct application and ongoing management of established quality practices.
