### 1. Which word means to ignore or pay no attention to?

- A. Vacate
- B. Premises

The idea being tested is finding a word that means to ignore or pay no attention to. Disregard fits this meaning exactly. It's a verb used when someone chooses not to consider something or to treat it as unimportant. For example, she disregarded the warning signs. The other options don't convey that sense: vacate means to leave a place; premises refers to property or a building; offset means to balance or compensate a difference.

### 2. Which word means occurring yearly?

- A. Transfer (a Phone Call)

- D. AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome)

Understanding how often something happens is about frequency words. The word that means occurring yearly is annual, which refers to events or actions that happen once each year—for example, an annual meeting or an annual report. The other options don't express frequency: transferring a phone call is about moving the call to another line, a phone extension is a reachable number, and AIDS is a medical condition. So annual is the word that clearly conveys "once per year."

### 3. What term refers to the bones of the body?

Skeleton is the term for the bones of the body. It provides structure, supports the body, protects organs, and gives muscles a framework to move against. Minerals are nutrients that help keep bones strong, but they aren't the bones themselves. Regulation describes the control of bodily processes, not the bones. A characteristic is a trait or feature, not the bones.

**4. A company's or store's written agreement to repair a product or refund your money if the product doesn't function properly**

A warranty is a written promise from the seller or manufacturer that a product will work as described and that if it doesn't, you'll receive a remedy such as repair, replacement, or a refund. This matches the description you're given because it focuses on a formal commitment to fix or compensate when the product fails. Warranties lay out what's covered, for how long, and what remedy will be provided, which is why they're the right concept for this scenario. Regulation refers to rules set by government or authorities, a nominating committee is involved in selecting leaders within an organization, and perpetuate means to continue something. None of these describe a formal promise to repair or refund a defective product like a warranty does.

Describing a feature or quality that distinguishes something is what this item is about. A trait that is typical of a person, place, or thing is called a characteristic. It's a property or quality that helps identify or describe what something is like. For example, a calm demeanor can be a characteristic of a careful driver, or the ability to glow in the dark can be a characteristic of certain minerals. A stereotype, in contrast, is an oversimplified belief about a group of people, not a specific feature of a thing. Minerals and warranty don't describe traits of things. So the word that fits the description is characteristic.

This item tests recognizing a word that means to ignore or pay no attention, and its noun form that expresses a lack of proper attention or respect. The word is disregard. As a verb, to disregard means to refuse to consider something or to ignore warnings or instructions. For example, they disregarded the warning signs. As a noun, disregard refers to a lack of proper attention or respect, as in a blatant disregard for safety rules. The other words don't fit: vacate means to leave a place; sanitary relates to cleanliness; project can mean to plan or to throw forward, or to estimate. So disregard is the best choice.

**7. Which term describes a condition in which the body cannot produce enough insulin?**

When the body cannot produce enough insulin, the term used is diabetes. Insulin is the hormone that helps glucose enter cells to be used for energy; without enough insulin, glucose remains in the blood and blood sugar levels rise. Diabetes refers to a group of disorders characterized by high blood sugar due to problems with insulin production or action. In type 1, the pancreas makes little or no insulin; in type 2, the body's cells don't respond well to insulin and production may decline over time. The other options describe unrelated things (a danger, prejudice, or something self-operating) and do not describe a medical condition related to insulin production.

**8. What term matches 'obedient to the law; peaceful and orderly'?**

Obedience to the law and peaceful, orderly behavior are described by the term law-abiding. This word names someone who follows laws, respects rules, and conducts themselves in a lawful, orderly way. For example, a law-abiding citizen follows traffic laws and complies with regulations. The other terms don't fit: opponents are people who disagree or resist; indemnification means compensation for loss; proposition is a suggested plan or idea. So the term that matches the definition is law-abiding.

**9. Which term is used for 'the right of a partner to be reimbursed'?**

The concept being tested is a financial protection that allows a partner to be paid back for expenses or losses incurred while acting for the business. This is called indemnification. In partnerships, indemnification is the agreement to reimburse a partner for costs they incur on behalf of the firm and to shield them from personal liability for those business-related losses. This makes sure a partner isn't out of pocket for legitimate expenses like fees or travel when carrying out partnership duties. The other terms don't fit because they refer to a medication, a disease, or a description of conduct, none of which capture the idea of reimbursing or protecting a partner's business expenditures.

**10. Which word means a disagreement among many people?**

**A. Controversy**

**Controversy captures a widespread disagreement among many people, especially a public or heated dispute about a topic. It implies opposing viewpoints held and debated across a community, not just a single argument. That makes it the best fit for “disagreement among many people.” For example, a town arguing about a proposed policy represents a controversy because there are multiple sides and ongoing debate. Defect means a flaw or imperfection, which isn’t about people arguing. Sanitary relates to cleanliness or health standards, not disagreement. Premises can mean the land and buildings of a property or the statements that form the basis of an argument, but it doesn’t convey a broad disagreement among many people.**
