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## **Explanations**

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### 1. Which word means to ask for?

- A. Prohibit
- B. Engage
- C. Vend
- D. Solicit**

The idea being tested here is finding a word that means to ask for. Solicit means to request or seek something from others, often in a formal or persistent way. You might say a nonprofit organization solicits donations, or someone solicits opinions or bids. The other words have different meanings: prohibit means to forbid; engage means to participate in or attract involvement; vend means to sell. So solicit is the best fit because it directly conveys the act of asking for something from others.

### 2. Which term from the list describes something that operates without external control?

Automatic describes something that runs or acts by itself without needing ongoing direction from an outside source. It implies a self-acting mechanism or preset rule that triggers actions without external control. The other terms don't fit this idea: racism is prejudice or discrimination based on race, hazard is a danger or risk, and tuition is money paid for instruction.

### 3. Which term describes being tried twice for the same crime?

Being tried twice for the same crime is described by the term double jeopardy. This protection prevents a person from facing another prosecution or punishment after a first trial has begun and reached a verdict or after an acquittal or conviction. Jeopardy attaches in a jury trial when the jury is sworn in (or in a bench trial when the first proceeding begins) and ends with a final judgment, an acquittal, or a conviction. The idea is to keep the legal process fair and final, avoiding repeated prosecutions for the same offense. The other terms don't fit here: habitability is about living conditions, obligation is a duty, and solicit means to ask for or entice—none of these relate to protections against being tried twice for the same crime.

**4. A rule or directive made and maintained by an authority.**

A rule or directive made and maintained by an authority is a regulation. Regulations are formal rules issued by governments or organizations to govern behavior and ensure compliance, safety, or standards, and they are enforceable with potential penalties for violations. A warranty is a promise about quality, not a rule issued by an authority; a skeleton is the basic framework or structure, not a rule; minerals are natural substances, not governing directives. So regulation best matches the concept described.

**5. Which term means to sell?**

The act described is selling. Vend means to sell goods or services to customers; it's a formal, sometimes old-fashioned term used in commerce, as in a street vendor who vends fruit at the market. Engage is about interacting or involving someone, not the act of selling itself. Solicit means to request or seek something, such as donations or orders, but it isn't the act of selling. Prohibit means to forbid something. So the word that directly means to sell is vend.

**6. Which verb means to push under the surface of water?**

Submerge is the verb that means to push under the surface of water. It describes placing something so it goes beneath the water line, often fully. For example, you can submerge a sponge to soak it, or a diver submerges to go underwater. The other options don't fit: exposure is about being visible or uncovered, not going under water; resurface means to come back up to the surface, the opposite action; compensation is unrelated to water and refers to making up for something or a payment.

## 7. Extreme tiredness, exhaustion.

Recognizing the word that means extreme tiredness. Extreme tiredness is fatigue. Dust Bowl points to a historical environmental disaster, not a feeling. Distinguished means notable or eminent, not a state of weariness. Criteria means standards or requirements, not a feeling of exhaustion. Fatigue is the noun that captures that sense of deep weariness or exhaustion after activity. For example, after hiking all day, fatigue set in. So fatigue is the best fit for the clue.

## 8. Which term is a sum of money charged for teaching or instruction by a school, college, or university?

- A. Tuition**

The main idea here is the money a school charges for teaching or instruction. That amount is known as tuition. It's the fee you pay to enroll in courses and receive instruction, often billed per term or per year, and sometimes shown separately from other costs like room, board, or textbooks. This term specifically refers to the cost of education itself. The other options don't fit this definition: an employee handbook is a document for workers that outlines policies, urgent describes something needing immediate action, and color-coded refers to a system of using colors to organize or categorize things.

## 9. Which word means to leave a place that one previously occupied?

- A. Premises
- B. Vacate**

- D. Controversy

Leaving a place you previously occupied is described by a verb that means to depart from a space you've been living in or using. The best choice is the verb vacate, because it specifically conveys the act of leaving and giving up possession of a space—used in contexts like tenants being asked to vacate the premises by a deadline. The other terms don't express that action: premises refers to the place itself, offset means to balance or counteract, and controversy means a dispute or disagreement.

**10. What does the term liable mean?**

- A. Legally responsible or obligated**
- B. A medical condition characterized by fever**
- C. A type of financial compensation**
- D. A formal agreement between parties**

**Liabile means legally responsible or obligated for something. In legal terms, if you are liable for damages, you are the one who must compensate or answer for them. This sense of responsibility shows up in courts, insurance, and contracts, where a person or organization is held accountable for harm, losses, or duties. While the word can also appear in everyday language as “likely to happen,” the intended meaning here is about being legally responsible. The other options describe a fever (a medical condition), a type of payment (a kind of compensation), or a formal agreement (a contract), which are not the meaning of liable.**
