Holden approaches the adult world with suspicion and fear, not acceptance. He resists being squeezed into “grown-up” roles and resents the demands that come with maturity. When adults try to mold him—teachers, parents, even potential employers—he pushes back, lying, skipping classes, getting into fights, and ultimately leaving Pencey. His coping strategy is to withdraw into evasive or reckless behavior rather than face responsibility. The idea of growing up feels loud and fake to him, which fuels his ongoing critique of “phoniness” in adults. Yet his fantasy of protecting children—dreaming of being a catcher in the rye who saves kids from falling into adulthood—shows both a longing for innocence and a deep avoidance of adult life. His journey through New York, his risky choices, and his eventual break illustrate how heavy the weight of adult expectations can be for him, producing cycles of avoidance and volatility rather than simple acceptance of growing up.

Holden’s longing is for a safe, unchanging space that can shield innocence and let him keep his own sense of self intact. This constancy acts as protection for innocence—things are preserved as they are, not warped by time or adult expectations—and it also supports Holden’s individuality by giving him a private, fixed backdrop in which his thoughts and ideas can remain unthreatened by change. The hat also ties to his protective impulses toward his sister Phoebe, reinforcing the idea that he wants to shield childhood innocence from corruption. In short, the red hunting hat encapsulates Holden’s longing to keep innocence intact while resisting the inauthentic pressures of the adult world.

That mitt becomes special to Holden because it preserves Allie’s voice and spirit, turning a ordinary glove into a personal symbol of connection and innocence that Holden clings to when the world feels confusing. The other options don’t fit: Allie wasn’t a famous baseball star, the mitt isn’t described as a family heirloom, and it wasn’t used for mentoring Holden. The key point is that Allie wrote poems on the mitt.

The thing this question is testing is memory of Holden's family details and what he says about them. Allie is Holden's younger brother who died of leukemia, and Holden describes Allie as the smartest Caufield. That combination—death by leukemia and being called the smartest—fits Allie exactly. The other names don't match: Holden himself is the living narrator, DB is an older brother who also lives and works as a writer, and Ackley is not a brother at all. So Allie is the correct match.

7. What does Holden say the car symbolizes, compared with the horse?

Holden uses symbols to show what he thinks people value. The car, in his view, embodies materialism—money, status, and a polished exterior designed to impress others rather than nurture real connection. The horse, by comparison, stands for something more personal and relational—a simpler, more genuine form of companionship rather than social signaling. So the car most clearly signals materialism, which is why that option fits best. It isn't about mere progress or control, and the horse isn't meant to symbolize wealth.

Phoebe's gesture shows a caring, protective side of her character. It isn't about money being more important than people, nor about wanting to leave home or seeking attention; it's a sincere show of concern and responsibility for her brother.

After Holden calls Sally Hayes, his next move is to wander into Central Park and sit by the duck pond. The duck pond scene is symbolic: Holden asks where the ducks go in winter, a question that mirrors his own fear of change and uncertainty about what to do next. It's a moment of loneliness and introspection, a pause in his city roaming that highlights his longing for stability amid the chaos of his thoughts.
