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Explanations

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1. Which statement correctly describes NOR memory?

- A. NOR memory is byte-addressable and used for code storage.

Byte-addressability with direct code access is what sets NOR flash apart. NOR memory allows reading and fetching individual bytes and even executing code in place, which makes it ideal for storing firmware and other program code that the processor runs directly from flash. This is why devices use NOR flash to hold the software that boots up and operates, because you can jump to and fetch instructions precisely where they are stored. The other statements don't capture this practical use. NOR flash tends to be more expensive and offer lower density than NAND, so it isn't used for high-density storage up to multi-terabyte sizes. It's also not typically chosen for bulk user data storage, where NAND dominates. While NOR is non-volatile, simply labeling it as non-volatile and reliable doesn't convey its defining role as page-by-page, byte-addressable code storage.

The key action in tagging is being able to pick from what already exists and also add something new if needed. This combination of discovering existing tags and adding a new one in the same place makes it the best fit for the task. The other windows generally serve related but different roles, such as viewing or selecting from a catalog without the integrated option to create a new tag on the fly.

The key idea is that actual artifacts from the device—like chat messages and any remnants of deleted items—are found in the device's data, not in separate timeline or archive sections. Device Data contains the extracted content from the phone, including messages and chats, and it can include items recovered from deleted data through analysis of the file system, caches, or unallocated space. The forensic timeline is a separate view that orders events across sources to show when things happened, but it doesn't store or hold the chat content itself. A chat archive is typically an export or collection of chat transcripts, which may not include items that were deleted or not yet exported. System logs are records of system and app events, not the actual chat content. So, for a potentially deleted chat, examining the device data is the most direct and reliable source to locate the actual artifacts.

Settings portability through import and export lets you back up a configuration and apply the same setup to another system or after a reinstall. If it weren't supported, you'd lose the ability to move configurations; if it were import only or export only, you'd gain one direction but miss the full portability.

Computing and comparing hashes across copies ensures the data hasn't changed since collection, which is crucial for trustworthiness and reproducibility. Verifying data integrity goes beyond hashing to confirm that artifacts are complete and uncorrupted in content and metadata. Cross-checking artifact counts helps detect omissions or duplications, confirming the extraction captured the expected items. Confirming that time stamps align across sources ensures the chronology is consistent and that events are properly synchronized, which is vital for accurate analysis and reporting. Relying on a tester's intuition is unreliable because human judgment can miss subtle inconsistencies. Hash values alone verify integrity but don't guarantee completeness or temporal consistency. Verifying only the number of artifacts, while ignoring timestamps, can hide timing mismatches and mislinked data. All these checks together provide a robust validation of the extraction results.

A smartphone is a convergence device: it blends communication with a full computing platform. This combination—phone capabilities plus advanced computing functions—is what defines a smartphone. The other options are too limited. Desktop computer capabilities are not required and smartphones work standalone without a dock. Office applications alone don't capture the broad computing power and on-the-go versatility smartphones provide. Calendar and alarms are basic features, far from the wide range of computing tasks a smartphone enables.

Operating systems provide the platform that coordinates all activities on a smartphone, including running apps, managing hardware resources (CPU, memory, storage, sensors, and radios), and presenting the user interface. They handle the lifecycle of apps, security and permissions, and offer drivers and libraries that apps rely on. This makes the OS the central software that makes the device usable at a high level. This is the best answer because it encompasses the full system that users interact with and that developers build on top of, rather than just a single component. Firmware sits closer to individual hardware components and isn't the complete platform for running apps. The kernel is a core part of an OS, handling low-level resource management, but the operating system includes the kernel plus the surrounding services and user-facing features. Middleware sits between applications and the OS to provide shared services, but it isn't the foundational platform that manages the device itself.

Protecting privacy when presenting results means limiting exposure of sensitive information and controlling how it's shared. The best practice is to redact or minimize PII in reports, restrict who can access the information to authorized personnel, and ensure that the distribution of results complies with applicable laws and internal policies. Redacting or minimizing PII reduces the amount of sensitive data that could be exposed if the report is shared or accessed by the wrong person. Limiting access ensures only those who need the data for their role can view it, lowering the risk of unauthorized disclosure. Ensuring compliant distribution means using secure channels, following privacy regulations such as the CCPA, and adhering to organizational data-handling procedures for sharing, storing, and retaining information. Including all PII defeats privacy protections and increases risk. Posting publicly exposes individuals and violates confidentiality. Encrypting only after sharing with the client leaves data vulnerable during initial handling and transmission.

Extraction duration is driven primarily by how much data must be read, processed, and moved, but the method and environment also shape that time. The more data you have to extract, the longer the process will take because every byte has to be read from storage, interpreted, and delivered to the output. The way you extract matters too: a full physical extraction pulls more information (including space that logical methods skip), so it usually takes longer than a logical extraction that targets specific data. The performance of the device—CPU speed, disk I/O, and available memory—sets how quickly read and write operations happen, while the operating system version and the tooling used can affect how efficiently those operations are carried out. If extraction happens over a network, network latency and bandwidth add additional time. The color of the device body has no impact. While data size is a key predictor of duration, the overall time is shaped by these surrounding factors as well.

A redacted report keeps the useful, non-sensitive details intact while protecting items like personal identifiers, confidential facts, or restricted data. The constraints come from policy and legal requirements: redactions must be thorough, consistent, and well-documented so that no sensitive information leaks and the report remains useful for its purpose. That's why the description that a redacted report masks sensitive information and that redactions must be thorough and policy-compliant is the best fit. Saying the report is optional or may be omitted doesn't align with what redaction means in practice, and descriptions that it's fully visible or only describes the scope don't capture the masking and policy-driven protection that redaction entails.
