This allows healthcare providers to observe how the heart behaves over time, especially during various activities and rest periods, which may bring out irregularities that weren't evident during the initial EKG. While the other options are relevant considerations, they do not specifically address the primary function of an ambulatory monitor as effectively as this answer does. For example, while checking for immediate issues or confirming EKG results could be relevant reasons for cardiac monitoring, they do not highlight the long-term rhythm analysis that is the primary purpose of using an ambulatory monitor.
