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Explanations

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1. What does choosing which dynamic extension to use determine?

- A. It determines the color of the user interface.

Choosing which dynamic extension to use determines how your dynamic parameter will filter reports built off your template. The extension defines the rules for how the parameter narrows the data, so different extensions can filter by date ranges, by region, by department, or by other criteria as the report runs. UI color, how many extensions exist, and the export format are governed by separate settings and are not controlled by the chosen extension. So the key idea is that the extension sets the filtering behavior applied to your template's reports.

Column Icons change how data is presented in the results grid of a Reporting Workbench report. They provide visual cues directly in the report's output, helping you interpret statuses, categories, or patterns as you view the results. Because of this, the feature affects the actual results content you see in the Reporting Workbench, not just aspects like chart legends, headers, or a raw data export. In short, it influences the results portion of the report when you generate or view it.

Dynamic extensions are reusable blocks of code in Epic that extend how Chronicles data is read and written, with each extension defining a value or a set of values to filter on. They run at runtime and provide flexible, configurable criteria that drive data access across different Epic processes without changing the underlying code. This isn't about pre-run scripts or static values embedded in a template, and it isn't about security roles. It's about injecting runtime, filterable criteria into Chronicles operations so the same code can be reused in different contexts by supplying different values. For example, a dynamic extension might specify a department or date range to filter encounters, and that filter can be adjusted without rewriting the logic.

A query template defines the blueprint for how data will be retrieved. It specifies which master files or data sources to search and which parameters can be used to constrain the search. This makes the template reusable and ensures consistency, since users can supply values for those parameters without changing the underlying query structure. It doesn't control how the results are presented, how end users interact with the UI, or any default formatting—that's handled by other parts of the reporting or presentation layer.

Dynamic extensions are the mechanism that provides values to dynamic parameters used by templates. They exist as records in the LPP master file, and templates read these records to obtain the actual values to plug into their dynamic parameters at runtime. This setup keeps the template logic stable while allowing the input data to change simply by updating the extension records. They're not blocks of code in the system registry, they aren't used to format report dates, and they aren't standalone values stored in Chronicles, so the described role—records in the LPP master file that supply values to dynamic parameters—best captures how dynamic extensions function.

Records are returned when at least one contact within the record matches the search criteria, or when a combination of contacts within that same record collectively satisfies it. This means the search uses OR logic across the contacts: you don't need every contact to fit the criteria, just one (or a set that together meets the requirements). If a single contact has the needed attributes, the record qualifies; alternatively, different contacts can contribute different parts of the criteria and still count as a match. This avoids being too strict by requiring all contacts to satisfy the criteria, or limiting the match to only the primary contact. It also isn't about whether the search itself includes a contact-based filter—the focus is on when a record is considered a match.

Following the network path means using built-in connections and configurations that tell the system how related data across master files should be accessed and joined. A networked parameter in the query is used to constrain or steer which related records are pulled, effectively guiding the traversal along the path. A linkage record added to the display column serves as a bridge that connects the current view to related records in another master file, enabling you to follow the relationship to see linked data. A Setup Data Extension in the template provides the rules and mapping for how to link to other master files, so the system knows precisely how to navigate between them. Creating a new master file in the base Master File, however, does not participate in following an existing network path; it simply introduces another data source rather than defining how to traverse or join across the predefined network relationships.

8. What is a networked item in Chronicles?

A networked item is the field that stores the ID of another record, creating a link between records in Chronicles. This kind of link lets you navigate from one item to its related item and pull in related data across the Chronicles network, enabling relational connections rather than just standalone data. By contrast, a field that records the date created is simply metadata about when the record came into existence, not a cross-reference. A field holding a user password is about authentication and security, not linking records. A field for a category name is a label used for classification, not establishing connections to other records. So, storing the ID of a record is what makes an item networked, because it provides the cross-record reference that links databases together.

9. If a parameter is Visible and marked as Default, what happens during evaluation?

Visible means the parameter appears to the user, and Default means there is a predefined value used if the user doesn't supply one. During evaluation, the system resolves the parameter's final value by using the user-provided input when available, or the default value if not. So even though it's shown and has a default, it still gets processed as part of the evaluation. It won't be ignored or hidden, because visibility implies it participates in evaluation, and the default provides a concrete value when nothing is entered.

10. In Workbench Templates, what are the two possible sources that Dynamic extensions typically use?

A. The current Hyperspace session at runtime; The User Security EMP record of the running user

B. The local disk cache; The server log

Dynamic extensions in Workbench Templates rely on live context about who is using the template and what they are allowed to do. The two sources they typically use are the current Hyperspace session at runtime, which provides the live session context (identity, locale, environment, and other runtime values), and the User Security EMP record for the running user, which contains the user's roles, permissions, and security attributes. This combination lets the extension adapt on the fly to the specific user's identity and privileges, such as showing or hiding options or enforcing access rules. The other options don't fit because they either store non-user-specific data (local disk cache, server log), or they don't capture who is using the template or what they can do (system clock, database snapshot), and using a password would be inappropriate and insecure.
