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Explanations

Gifts given to church leaders are meant to equip God's people for works of service, so the whole body is built up. Scripture describes leaders—apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers—as gifts from Christ to the church to train and empower believers. This training aims to unify the church and help everyone grow in faith and the knowledge of Jesus, reaching spiritual maturity. It's about edifying the body through ministry, not about generating wealth, managing property, or deciding how long a sermon should be.

The other names were important figures in related movements, but Mason is the founder of COGIC.

Persecution and enduring pressure from the outside world is what this church is known for in the Revelation letters. Smyrna is described as facing tribulation and suffering, even poverty, with encouragement to stay faithful through the trials. The message isn't about condemnation for spiritual compromise; it's about perseverance under persecution, with a promise of the crown of life for those who remain faithful unto death. That contrast helps distinguish Smyrna from the others, whose descriptions focus on spiritual complacency, counterfeit appearances, or materialism rather than active persecution. So, the church described as the persecuted one is Smyrna.

The main idea being tested is how the Old Testament is grouped into large sections. In most Christian study materials, the Old Testament is organized into four major sections: Law, History, Poetry/Writings, and Prophets. The phrase Book of History is a common shorthand for that entire block of historical narratives, not a single book. So, within this framework, the statement is true.

Ezra and Nehemiah focus on the return from exile to the land of Judah and the rebuilding of Jerusalem and its temple and walls. So the part of Israel being restored is the Southern Kingdom, the territory around Judah in and around Jerusalem.

Safe sanctuary policies establish a consistent, nonjudgmental, and zero-tolerance stance toward abuse, making sure everyone understands that violence has no place and that safety is the priority. Confidential reporting gives victims and witnesses a trusted way to disclose without fear of retaliation or stigma, which is crucial for them to seek help. Referrals to resources connect people to shelters, legal aid, counseling, and advocacy services, ensuring immediate protection and long-term support. Trained responders—staff or volunteers who know how to listen, assess risk, set boundaries, and respond sensitively—offer a trauma-informed approach that respects the survivor's autonomy while guiding them to safety. Legal compliance ensures the church follows mandatory reporting laws where required, maintains proper records, and coordinates with authorities and protection agencies, balancing confidentiality with safety and accountability. Other options miss key safeguards: encouraging victims to handle it alone ignores safety needs and support systems; offering only counseling referrals without reporting lacks risk management and practical protection; denying violence denies reality and undermines trust and safety within the community.
