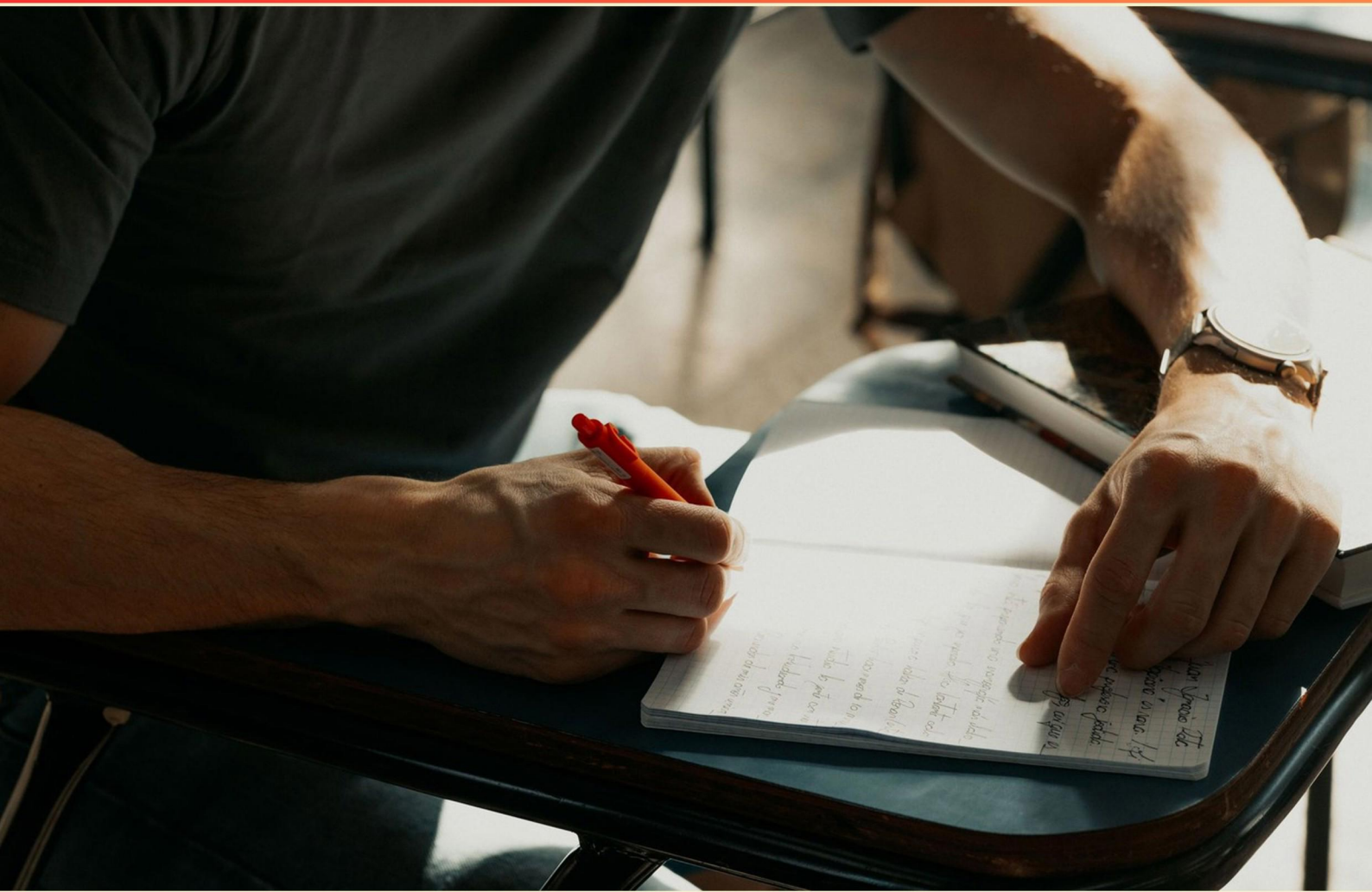

Peer review is used to gain feedback on the essay in order to improve its quality and effectiveness.
