1. The Trojans mascot is associated with which university?

- A. USC**
- B. UCLA**
- C. Oregon**

The Trojans are the official nickname of the University of Southern California's athletic teams, and their mascot is tied to that USC identity. UCLA uses the Bruins, Oregon uses the Ducks, and Fresno State uses the Bulldogs, so the university associated with the Trojans mascot is USC.

2. Which school has the mascot 'Roadrunners'?

- A. UTSA**
- B. Charlotte**
- C. Old Dominion**
- D. Georgia Southern**

Team identities often hinge on a mascot that captures the school's spirit. UTSA, the University of Texas at San Antonio, uses the Roadrunners as its team nickname, with Rowdy the Roadrunner as the official mascot. The school is located in San Antonio, Texas. The other schools listed have different mascots—Charlotte's teams are the 49ers, Old Dominion's are the Monarchs, and Georgia Southern's are the Eagles—so Roadrunners uniquely belongs to UTSA.

3. Which university's mascot is the Golden Flashers?

Think of mascots as the school's unique athletic identity. The Golden Flashes are the official nickname for Kent State University's teams, and the mascot connected with them is Flash the Golden Flash. That direct link makes Kent State the university tied to the Golden Flashers. The other options have their own mascots—Buffalo with the Bulls, Ball State with the Cardinals, and Massachusetts with the Minutemen/Minutewomen—so they don't match the Golden Flashes.

4. The Utes are the mascots for which university?

Utes is the nickname used by the University of Utah's athletic teams. The Ute are a Native American tribe originally from the Utah region, and the university adopted that name to honor them. Among the options, the other schools are associated with different mascots—California is the Golden Bears, Arizona State University is the Sun Devils, and Colorado is the Buffaloes. So the university that uses the Utes as its mascot is the University of Utah.

5. The SMU football team uses which mascot?

- A. Tigers**
- B. Blazers**

SMU's football program is identified by the Mustangs—the team nickname used in games, logos, and branding. While SMU does have a live mascot tradition with Peruna the collie, the widely recognized team identity for competition is Mustangs. The other names—Tigers, Blazers, Knights—belong to other schools and aren't the SMU nickname, so they don't fit here.

6. Which university has the mascot Golden Panthers?

- A. Florida International**
- B. Louisiana-Lafayette**

This question tests your knowledge of college mascots and team nicknames. The phrase Golden Panthers refers to the former nickname used by Florida International University's athletic programs, pairing the panther as the mascot with a gold theme. That historical branding is why Florida International is associated with the Golden Panthers. In contrast, the other universities have different mascots: Louisiana-Lafayette is the Ragin' Cajuns, Louisiana-Monroe is the Warhawks, and Troy is the Trojans. So the university tied to the Golden Panthers is Florida International University.

7. Appalachian State's mascot?

Appalachian State's mascot is the Mountaineers, chosen to honor the rugged spirit of the Appalachian Mountains that frame the campus. This name appears in the team branding, logos, and traditions, making it the distinctive identity of Appalachian State among the options. The other names—Panthers, Aggies, and 49ers—are mascots associated with different schools or contexts: Panthers is used by several programs, Aggies by agricultural colleges such as Texas A&M, and 49ers by the San Francisco NFL team (and sometimes by other groups inspired by the 1849 gold rush). So Mountaineers best fits Appalachian State.

8. Oklahoma State's mascot is which of the following?

The main idea is identifying a school's team identity and its mascot. Oklahoma State's athletic programs are known as the Cowboys (with Cowgirls in women's sports), and their recognizable costumed mascot is Pistol Pete, a Western cowboy. That connection to a cowboy figure is what links to the Cowboys option. The other names belong to different schools—Sooners for the University of Oklahoma, Yellow Jackets for Georgia Tech, and Bobcats for other programs—so they don't match Oklahoma State.

9. The Blazers mascot is associated with which school?

- A. UAB**
- B. Akron
- C. Blazers
- D. Rice

Mascots and team nicknames are tied to a specific school's athletic program. The Blazers is the nickname used by the University of Alabama at Birmingham's teams, so the mascot associated with that name is linked to UAB. Akron is known as the Zips, Rice as the Owls, and "Blazers" is not a separate school name. Therefore, the Blazers mascot is associated with the University of Alabama at Birmingham.

10. Oklahoma State's mascot is which of the following?

A. Sooners

B. Cowboys

C. Bobcats

D. Yellow Jackets

The main idea here is recognizing which school uses which team nickname and mascot. Oklahoma State University teams are known as the Cowboys (and Cowgirls), and their mascot is a cowboy figure often represented by Pistol Pete. So the best answer is Cowboys because that name specifically corresponds to Oklahoma State. The other options belong to different schools: Sooners are the University of Oklahoma's teams, Yellow Jackets belong to Georgia Tech, and Bobcats are used by other institutions.
