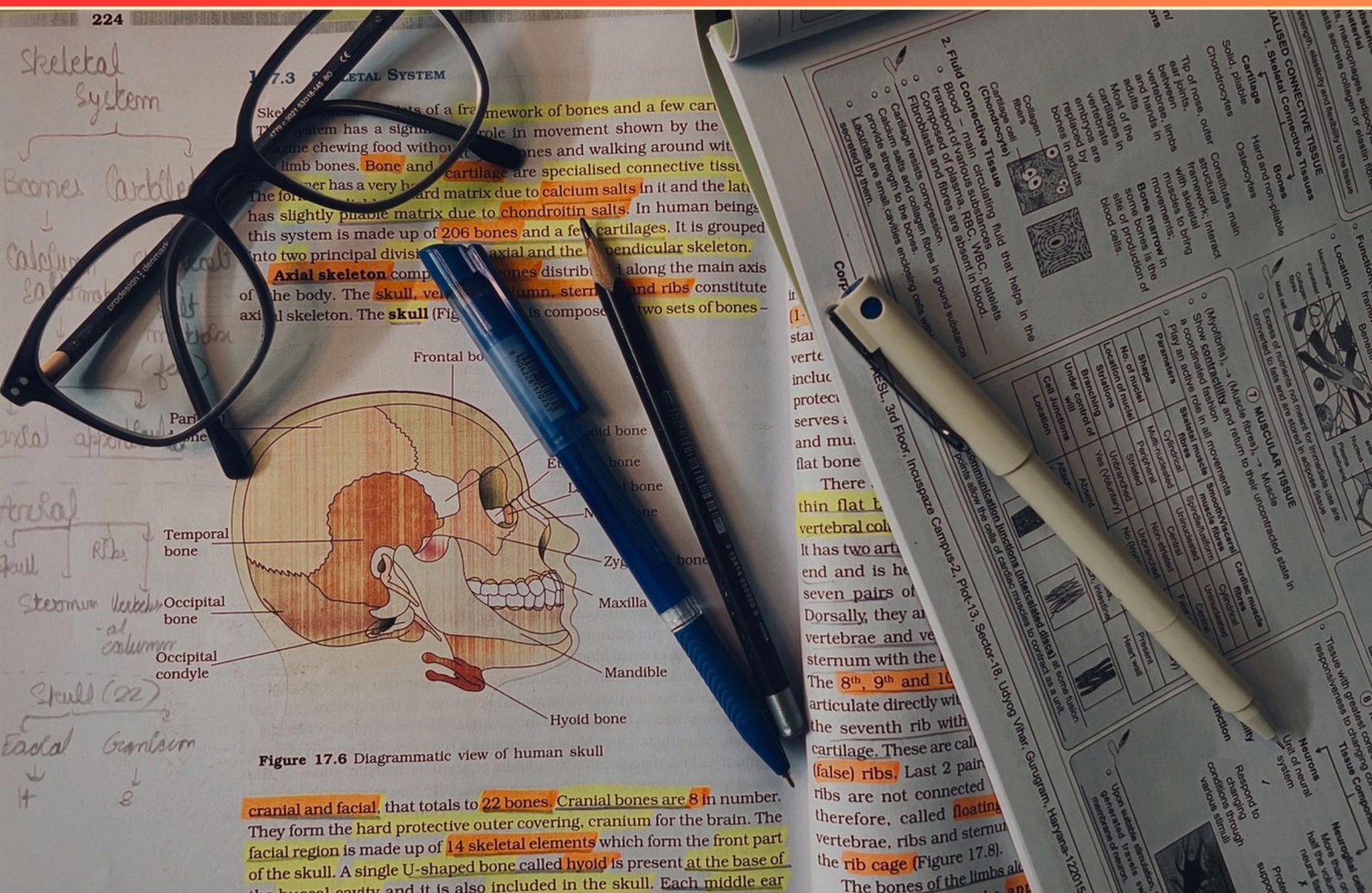

Trust involves reliability and competence, respect entails recognizing and honoring the client's dignity and autonomy, and professional intimacy refers to the closeness developed through a professional relationship. However, the specific action of listening and validating is core to the practice of empathy.
