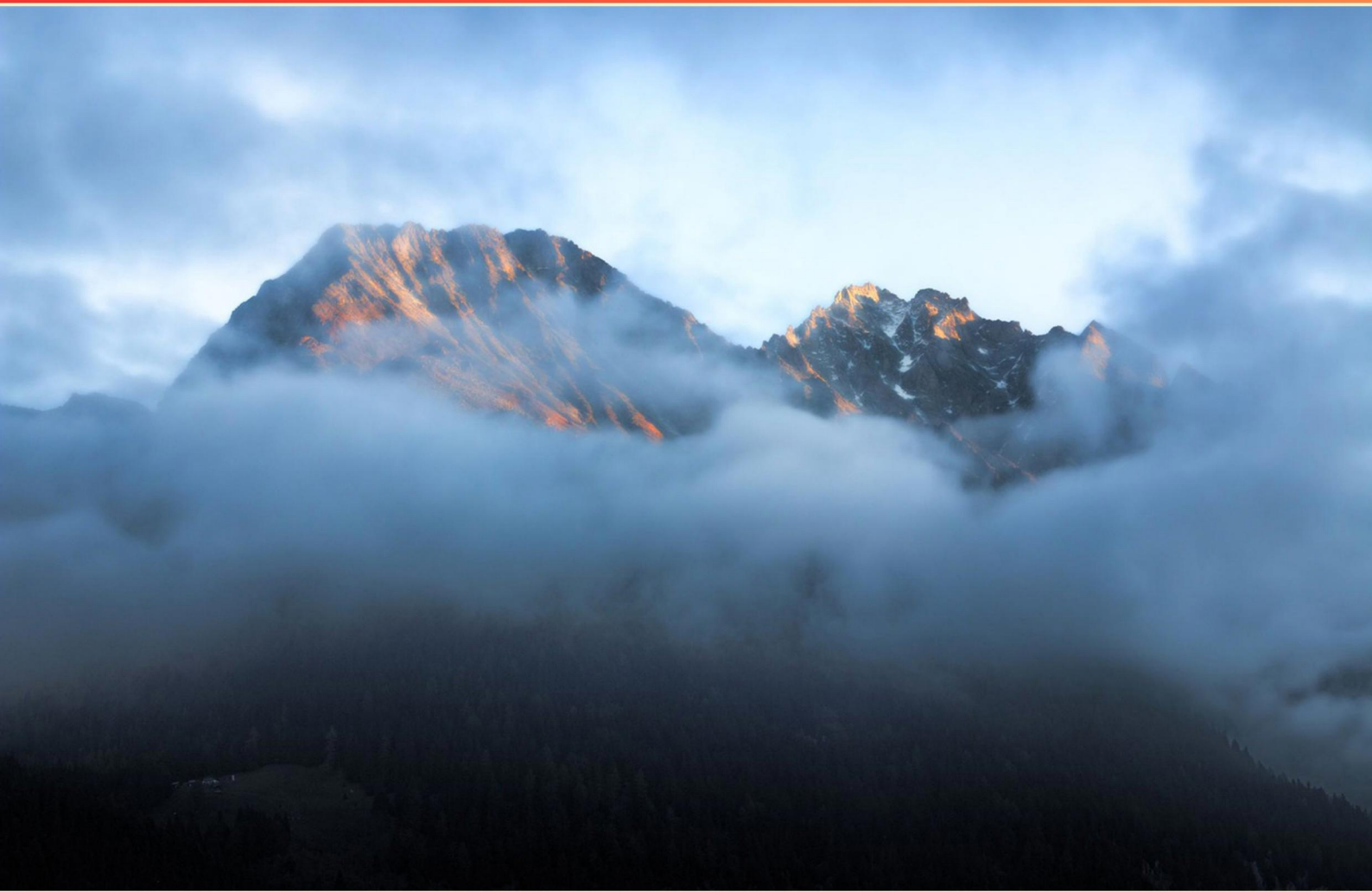

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Explanations

The other options mentioned (B, C, D) are all important steps in the firing process, but they cannot occur without first pulling the trigger.
