Apartheid centers on racial segregation. It was a formal system in South Africa where the state enforced strict separation of people by race across all aspects of life—where you could live, work, go to school, travel, and even whom you could marry—through laws and policing. The goal was to maintain white minority dominance by creating unequal rights and opportunities for non-white groups. The term itself means "apart-ness," underscoring that the core idea is separating people by race and hard-wiring those separations into everyday life. The other options describe programs focused on reform, exchange, or redistribution, which do not capture the legally enforced, systematic separation that defines apartheid.

Shi'a Islam is the majority in Iran and has a historic, culturally strong presence across the border in southern Iraq, where large Shia communities are centered around key religious sites in Najaf and Karbala. This gives the neighboring country a substantial Shi'a population alongside Iran. The other neighboring countries have Shi'a populations too, but not in the same concentrated way: Afghanistan's Shi'a are a minority, Syria has a significant but smaller Shi'a-aligned group, and Saudi Arabia's Shi'a communities are a minority mainly in the eastern region. So, the neighbor country where Shi'a population is notably concentrated alongside Iran is Iraq.

This often happens through contact and exposure—media, travel, migration—so traits from Western culture such as clothing styles or religious ideas can be adopted and adapted locally. It's a clear example of cultural diffusion in which ideas and practices move across cultures and are incorporated, rather than something biological or purely physical like weather patterns or trade networks.

Non-material culture consists of intangible ideas and practices that shape how people think and behave, such as beliefs, values, traditions, and practices. The other options—beliefs, traditions, and values—are ideas and shared meanings, not physical objects, so they fit non-material culture.

Dialects differ across several aspects of language, not just one. They can involve vocabulary—the words used and their meanings; pronunciation—the sounds and how words are spoken; spelling—the writing conventions that may vary regionally; and even the speed of speech, which reflects rhythm and tempo in delivery. Because dialect variation spans these multiple features, the option that includes vocabulary, spelling, pronunciation, and speed of speech best captures how dialects differ. Focusing on only grammar, only script, or only vocabulary misses important parts of how dialects manifest in real communication.

The greatest concentration of Asians in Canada is in the Greater Toronto Area, in Ontario. This reflects Toronto's role as Canada's largest city and economic hub, which has drawn large waves of Asian immigrants over several decades. The GTA hosts diverse Asian communities—Chinese, South Asian, Filipino, and others—and a well-developed network of shops, services, schools, and cultural institutions that support settled communities. While Vancouver also has a substantial Asian population and a high share within its metro area, the total number of Asians living in the Toronto region is larger. Calgary and Montreal have growing communities as well, but Toronto remains the city with the largest concentration.

Language use in government and schooling often mirrors a country's colonial history. In Senegal, French is the official language, which shows the lasting influence of its time as a French colony. After gaining independence, keeping French as the official language provides a common medium across diverse ethnic groups and keeps ties with international institutions where French has long been used. If the colonial history were dominated by Britain, English would typically function as the official language; Portuguese or Spanish would reflect those respective colonial eras. The Senegalese pattern, however, aligns with French colonial influence, making French the best fit.

Folk cultures are rooted in place and in small, tightly knit communities. Instead, folk cultures stay strongly tied to a specific locale and its unique practices rather than a single national banner. When folk traditions do spread, it tends to be slow and localized, rather than rapidly sweeping across a nation.

This idea highlights how the natural world creates opportunities and constraints that influence where people settle, what they grow, how they build, and how their cultures evolve. That's why it's the best answer: it directly links the environment to human culture and development. For example, river valleys often support centralized civilizations because of reliable water and fertile land, while desert or rugged areas push different adaptations like nomadic lifestyles or advanced irrigation. In contrast, saying technology alone determines culture places the driver on human invention rather than the environment; claiming climate has no effect ignores the strong ways weather and climate shape livelihoods; and the notion that culture determines the environment reverses the direction of influence that environmental determinism describes.

People practice folk customs to keep their traditional cultures alive across generations. This motivation stands apart from fashion trends, which are about current styles and outward signals rather than preserving long-standing ways of life. Folk customs endure because they reinforce group identity and social bonds, not because they align with what's popular at the moment. They aren't driven by cost or by illegality in any way; many traditions are practical and affordable, and they're typically supported by communities as part of cultural heritage rather than legal constraints.
