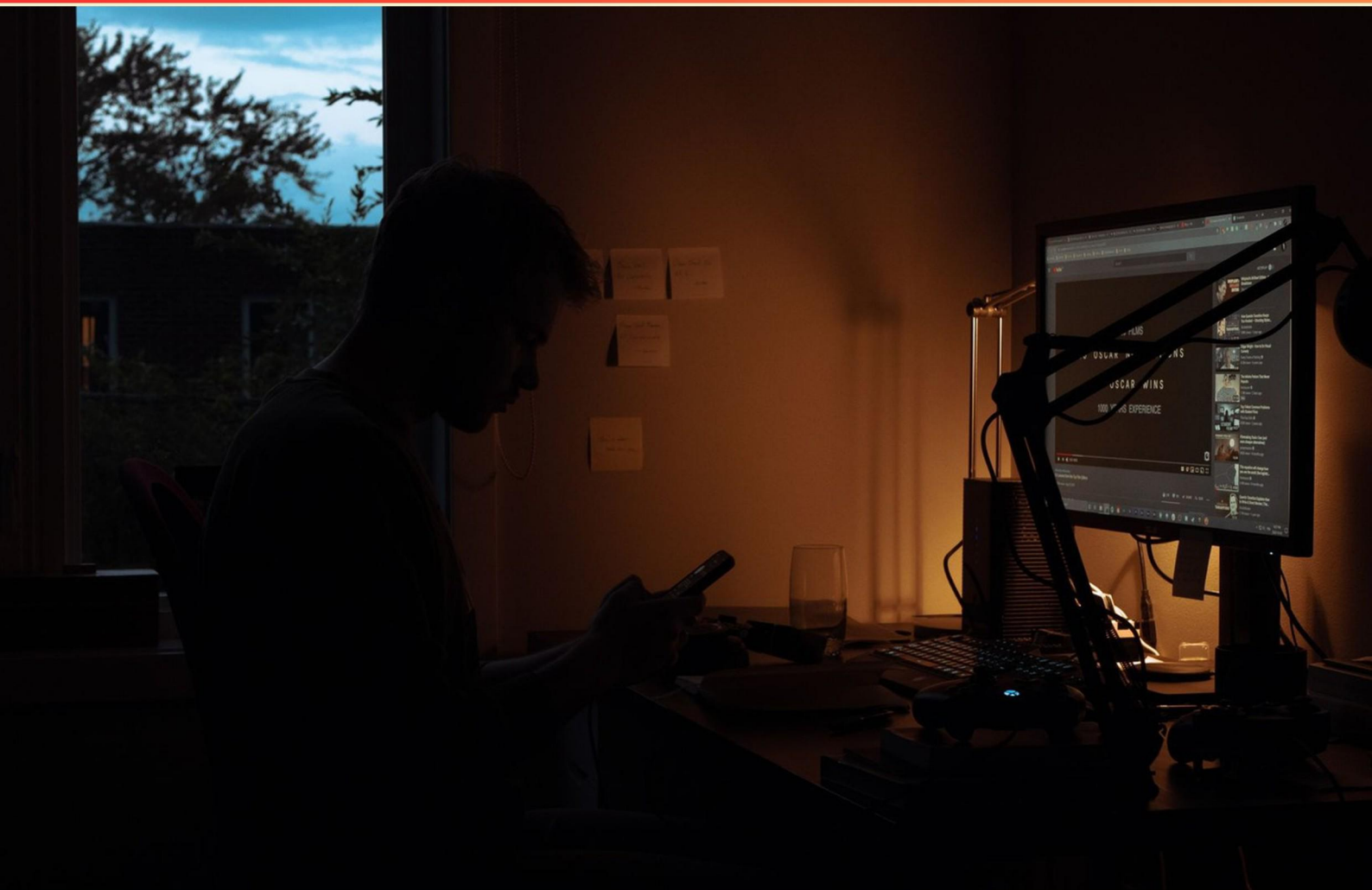

However, it is encryption that specifically ensures the confidentiality and integrity of the data being transmitted during online transactions.

Hot-swapping refers to the ability to replace components in a system without shutting it down, which does not relate to IP address configuration in networking scenarios.

A type of firewall configuration does not relate to domains, as firewalls focus on controlling incoming and outgoing network traffic based on predetermined security rules. Lastly, a protocol used for remote access does not pertain to the concept of a domain, which is more about network structure and administration rather than specific communication protocols.
