Their roles do not directly pertain to optimizing the efficiency of local network performance compared to load balancers.

Defining variables enables the creation of different storage spaces for different values, helping to keep a program organized and efficient.

Consequently, these options do not accurately define the function of a router, reinforcing that the correct classification is as a networking device.
