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## **Explanations**

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**1. Which accessibility feature helps users perform keyboard shortcuts without pressing multiple keys at once?**

- A. Sticky Keys**
- B. Filter Keys
- C. Toggle Keys
- D. Speech Recognition

*The idea being tested is how to use keyboard shortcuts when you can't press several keys at the same moment. Sticky Keys lets modifier keys like Ctrl, Alt, or Shift stay active after you press them, so you can press the other key shortly after to complete a shortcut (for example, pressing Ctrl first, then C to copy). This is especially helpful for users with limited dexterity because it removes the need to press two keys exactly together. The other options don't address this need. Filter Keys adjusts how the keyboard reacts to rapid or repeated keystrokes but doesn't enable sequential key presses for shortcuts. Toggle Keys plays a sound when Lock keys are pressed, which is a different accessibility aid. Speech Recognition uses voice input to control the computer, not keyboard shortcuts through key sequences.*

*NAT's purpose is to let many devices on a private network share a single public internet address by translating private IP addresses to a public IP (often also translating port numbers). This boundary translation lets outbound connections from multiple devices appear as separate flows to the outside world, while the internal addressing remains private. The other options describe encryption on the wire, domain-name resolution, or domain-name to IP mapping, which are not what NAT does.*

**3. Digital information processed into a useful form is called \_\_\_\_.**

*The main idea here is what you get after a computer processes information. When digital information has been transformed into something meaningful and useful, that result is called the output. The system takes input data, uses software to process it, and the end product you see or receive (on screen, as a printout, etc.) is the output. Data refers to raw facts, not yet processed. Input is what you feed into the system. Software is the programs that perform the processing. These terms describe stages before or with processing, not the final processed result itself.*

#### 4. In Windows, the only way to copy or move files is to use the Clipboard.

You can copy or move files in Windows without using the Clipboard. While the Clipboard is used when you select Copy or Cut followed by Paste, Windows also lets you perform these actions directly through the user interface and other tools. For example, you can drag files with the mouse to another folder to move them, or drag with the Ctrl key pressed to copy instead of moving. You can also use the right-click context menu to choose Copy or Move and then Paste elsewhere, or use command-line commands like move or copy (and more advanced tools like Robocopy) to relocate or duplicate files. So the statement isn't true because there are multiple ways to copy or move files beyond just the Clipboard.

#### 5. When a folder is deleted, where are its contents typically moved?

- A. The Recycle Bin or Trash**

When you delete a folder, the system moves it to a special holding area called the Recycle Bin or Trash. This provides a safety net, so you can restore the folder if you change your mind or realize you deleted the wrong thing. It isn't permanently removed from the disk until you empty the bin (or Trash). The Windows Registry, on the other hand, stores configuration settings for the system and applications, not deleted files. The Startup folder is a place where programs are launched automatically at startup, not a delete destination. The Desktop is simply a workspace where you place files and shortcuts; deleted items don't go there by default. (Note: some actions can bypass the Recycle Bin and permanently delete items, but the typical behavior is to move to the Recycle Bin or Trash.)

#### 6. Which statement describes one cloud service model correctly?

Cloud service models describe who handles which parts of the stack. Platform as a Service provides a platform for building and deploying applications, including runtime, libraries, and development tools, so you can focus on writing code rather than managing servers or the underlying infrastructure. This makes it the best description because it centers on offering a ready-to-use environment for application development and deployment. Think of the other models in terms of what you still have to manage: IaaS delivers virtualized hardware resources (compute, storage, networks) that you configure and manage, including operating systems and runtime environments. SaaS delivers end-user software that you simply use over the internet, without worrying about the underlying platform or hardware. And cloud services are designed to run off a provider's data centers (not on your own premises), though some environments can be hybrid—so the idea that all cloud models require on-prem hardware isn't accurate.

*Sticky Keys is an accessibility feature that changes how keyboard shortcuts are entered. It lets you press modifier keys like Ctrl, Alt, or Shift one at a time and still trigger a shortcut when you press the next key. For example, you can press Ctrl, release it, and then press C to copy, instead of needing to press Ctrl and C together. This makes it easier for people who have trouble pressing multiple keys at once. It doesn't disable shortcuts or slow down normal typing, and it isn't about moving the cursor with the keyboard—that would be a different feature like Mouse Keys.*

## 8. What is a practical reason to use a flash drive when working on multiple computers?

*The practical idea being tested is portability—the ability to move your data between different computers without relying on a network. A USB flash drive is small, removable storage you can carry in your pocket, and you can plug it into any computer with a USB port to access your files offline. This makes it convenient when you need to switch machines while keeping the same documents, media, or installers handy. It isn't primarily about security, speed, or automatic backups: cloud services can offer encryption and remote access, a flash drive won't speed up a computer, and backups require you to copy files yourself. So the best choice is to carry your data between computers with you.*

## 9. What is a VPN and its purpose?

- A. A public network with no encryption.

*A VPN works by creating a secure, encrypted tunnel for your data as it travels over a public network. The encryption scrambles information so that anyone who intercepts it can't read it, and the traffic appears to come from the VPN server instead of your device, helping protect your privacy. This setup is especially important on untrusted networks (like café Wi Fi) and also enables secure remote access to private networks. The other descriptions don't fit because a public network with no encryption would expose data rather than protect it; storing passwords locally is about credential management, not securing data in transit; and a protocol for streaming multimedia is about delivering content, not safeguarding a connection.*

10. The statement 'Before you can open and edit a compressed file, you need to zip it' is true or false?

*Opening a compressed file does not require zipping it first. A compressed archive is already in a compact form, and to edit its contents you typically extract or unzip the archive to access the individual files. Once extracted, you can make changes as you would with any normal files. If you later want to share or store the edited content again, you can create a new compressed archive by zipping it. In short, extraction comes before editing, not the other way around, so the statement is false.*
