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Explanations

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1. Which method can be used post-wax to calm and soothe a client's skin if redness and swelling results from the treatment?

A. Aloe gel and cool compresses

When skin is red and swollen after waxing, the aim is to calm inflammation and restore comfort without adding irritation. Aloe gel provides moisture and contains soothing, anti-inflammatory properties that cool the skin and help reduce irritation. A cool compress adds an immediate cooling effect and helps constrict swollen vessels, which decreases redness and swelling. Together, they address both moisture and temperature, offering gentle relief that dries or heat-inducing methods do not. Alcohol wipes are drying and can sting sensitive skin, warm compresses raise the area's temperature and may worsen inflammation, and a cold water rinse alone lacks ongoing soothing and moisturizing benefits.

A longer nail matrix means more tissue available to produce keratinocytes that form the nail plate. With more cells laid down before hardening, more layers accumulate, resulting in a thicker nail plate. The shape or curve of the nail plate is determined mainly by the matrix's width and the underlying bone and nail bed, not by simply increasing the matrix length. So, extending the matrix increases thickness, not thinning, no change, or curvature.

Enzyme peels exfoliate by breaking down proteins in dead skin cells, and they come in several forms. When using one during steam, you want a consistency that stays moist on the skin and can be activated to the right thickness. The powder form fits this best because you mix it with water to create a fresh paste right before application. This allows you to control dilution and thickness, and it clings to the steamy skin without drying out or running off. Gel or liquid forms can dry or slip in a humid environment, and creams can feel heavy or leave a film. So, powder form is ideal for steam treatments because it remains moist, lets you adjust the activation level, and delivers the enzyme effectively without drying the skin.

This helps ensure the wrap adheres smoothly without transferring dust or oil to the nail. By contrast, wooden sticks can absorb oils and dust, metal pushers can leave residues or scratch the nail, and a glass plate, while non-porous, is less practical for hand pressing and can be less durable in routine use.

The Service Record Card is designed to capture, across visits, every service performed, the formulations and products used, the results achieved, and any sensitivities or allergies the client may have. This focused record helps practitioners tailor future services, avoid adverse reactions, and track progress over time. Other terms don't fit as precisely. A History Ledger isn't a standard salon term for this purpose, a Client File tends to be a broader collection of information (demographics, medical history, preferences) rather than the ongoing, service-by-service progress log, and a Treatment Log is typically used for daily notes rather than a formal, permanent record of all services and products used.

Disulfide bonds are the bonds that involve sulfur atoms in hair. When chemical processes like perms or relaxers use reducing agents, these bonds can be broken and later re-formed through oxidation, which is why such treatments can permanently alter texture. Other bonds in hair, like hydrogen bonds or ionic bonds, are weaker and more easily disrupted by moisture or pH changes, while peptide bonds connect amino acids in the protein backbone but don't provide the same cross-link strength. So the sulfur-containing cross-links that lock keratin fibers together are the disulfide bonds responsible for hair's strength.

In the salon world, haircolor is the umbrella term used for all artificial hair coloring products and services. This label covers permanent, semi-permanent, and demi-permanent color, along with lighteners, toners, glosses, and color-depositing products. It's the standard terminology you'll see in product lines, training materials, and client consultations, so it best represents the entire category of coloring services rather than a specific type. Dyes describe a chemical component rather than the service category, tint refers to a more specific tonal product, and colorants is a broad chemistry term that doesn't designate the professional service category the way haircolor does.

High-frequency electrotherapy is delivered through a single electrode. The energy comes from one wand or glass electrode placed on the skin, and the electrical circuit is completed through the client and the unit's return path. Because only one active contact point is used at a time, the system remains simple and safe for standard facial treatments. Attachments or indirect application methods are variations of the same single-electrode setup, not additional active electrodes contacting the skin at once.

10. To achieve a natural look when cutting a wig, the ends should be ____.

To look natural, the ends should be tapered. Tapering means the hair length gradually decreases toward the tips, creating a soft, feathered edge that blends smoothly with the rest of the wig and with the wearer's facial lines. This avoids a harsh, blunt line that often looks artificial on wigs. While layered cuts can add texture, they can also create visible steps if not blended, and uneven ends tend to read as intentionally irregular. A tapered finish reduces bulk at the ends and helps the wig move and sit more like real hair, producing a more natural appearance.
