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Explanations

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1. Which substance is an organic compound that has a super-hydrating effect on skin cells and is used in callus softeners?

- A. Glycerin
- B. Salicylic Acid

Urea is the substance that fits this description because it acts as a powerful humectant, drawing and holding moisture in the skin to keep cells well hydrated. It's also used in higher concentrations in callus softeners because it has keratolytic properties, meaning it helps to soften and break down hardened keratin in thick skin. This dual action—deep hydration plus softening of the thickened outer layer—makes it particularly effective for treating calluses. By comparison, salicylic and lactic acids mainly exfoliate and break down keratin, rather than providing strong hydration. Glycerin is also a humectant, but urea's combination of moisturizing and keratolytic effects makes it the best fit for both super-hydration and softening calluses.

Reviewing the intake form is the best first step because it immediately provides essential background about the client—medical history, medications, allergies, skin conditions, past reactions, and specific goals. This information helps you identify safety concerns or contraindications and shapes the questions you'll ask to uncover the client's needs. With that context, you can tailor the consultation to be focused, efficient, and personalized from the start. Greeting the client and building rapport is important, but it doesn't supply the critical data you need to plan safely and effectively. Explaining pricing or suggesting services should come after you've reviewed the client's information and clarified their goals.

Hormones are chemical messengers that travel through the bloodstream to signal other parts of the body and regulate various physiological processes. Insulin, adrenaline, and estrogen all fit this role because each is produced by a gland and acts on target tissues to influence metabolism, stress responses, and reproductive development. They aren't enzymes, which speed up chemical reactions; they aren't nucleic acids, which store genetic information; and while some hormones are proteins and others are steroids, their defining feature here is their signaling function. Insulin is a peptide hormone that lowers blood glucose, adrenaline primes the body for quick action, and estrogen governs reproductive traits and cycles. So, they are hormones.

The bonds that cross-link the hair's cortex to give it elasticity and strength are disulfide bonds, salt bonds, and hydrogen bonds. Disulfide bonds are covalent links between sulfur atoms in cysteine amino acids; they are the strongest of the three and largely determine the hair's shape and structural integrity. Salt bonds are ionic connections between oppositely charged side chains; they're weaker than disulfide bonds and easily affected by pH changes, contributing to how the hair holds a chemical service's result. Hydrogen bonds are weaker interactions between hydrogen and electronegative atoms, but there are many of them, so they collectively influence how the hair behaves with moisture and heat, affecting temporary elasticity and shape. Because all three types form the network that gives the cortex its strength and elasticity, this option is the most complete description. Choices mentioning only one or two types don't capture the full cross-linking system.

It isnates forward with the content, rather than staying in place or changing in other ways. The other concepts don't capture this forward-shifting behavior. A stationary guide stays where it is and doesn't migrate a fragment forward. A boundary guide focuses on edges between sections rather than moving content forward. A progressive guide implies gradual updates, but not the act of relocating a specific slice to become the new guideline.

Growth pattern is the term that describes the direction in which hair grows from the scalp and how it naturally falls. This concept is central in styling and cutting because you want your technique to follow the hair's natural direction. When you align your parting, layers, and other techniques with the growth pattern, the hair lies smoother and results look more even and controlled. The other terms describe different ideas: hairline orientation refers to the shape and position of the hairline itself, not how the hair grows from the scalp; fall direction isn't a standard way to name this concept; and texture direction relates to the hair's texture (straight, wavy, curly) rather than the growth direction.

When a nail enhancement grows out, the maintenance needed is to rebuild the product at the area near the cuticle where the natural nail has pushed up against the old product. This targeted application to the new growth is known as backfill. It creates a seamless transition from the cuticle area to the existing enhancement, keeps the nail strong, and helps prevent lifting at the base of the nail. In contrast, a refill is a more general term for maintenance and can refer to reapplying product along the entire length, not just the proximal growth area. An overlay is simply a layer added over the natural nail or over a tip to create a finished surface without addressing growth at the cuticle, and tip fill refers to filling at the tip area when tips are used, not the new growth near the cuticle.

The central idea is that one bone acts as the connecting hub for the cranium. The sphenoid sits in the middle of the skull base and forms joints with nearly all the other cranial bones—frontal, parietal, temporal, occipital, and ethmoid—as well as several facial bones. Because it interfaces with multiple bones in many directions, it holds the cranium together like a keystone in an arch. Its butterfly shape, with greater and lesser wings, helps define the eye sockets and the nasal area, reinforcing its role as the primary connector of the skull.

For a precision blowout with minimal volume, you want control and a smooth surface that holds crisp lines. Classic styling brushes are designed for that: they have a medium barrel and firm bristles that grip the hair and allow you to pull each section taut as you dry. This controlled tension helps flatten the cuticle and directs the hair into the desired shape without creating extra lift, giving a sleek, low-volume result. In contrast, vent brushes speed drying and add lift, round brushes create volume and curl, and boar bristle brushes, while smoothing, are more about a natural finish than maintaining crisp precision. So the classic styling brush provides the right balance of direction, control, and surface smoothness for a precise, minimal-volume look.
