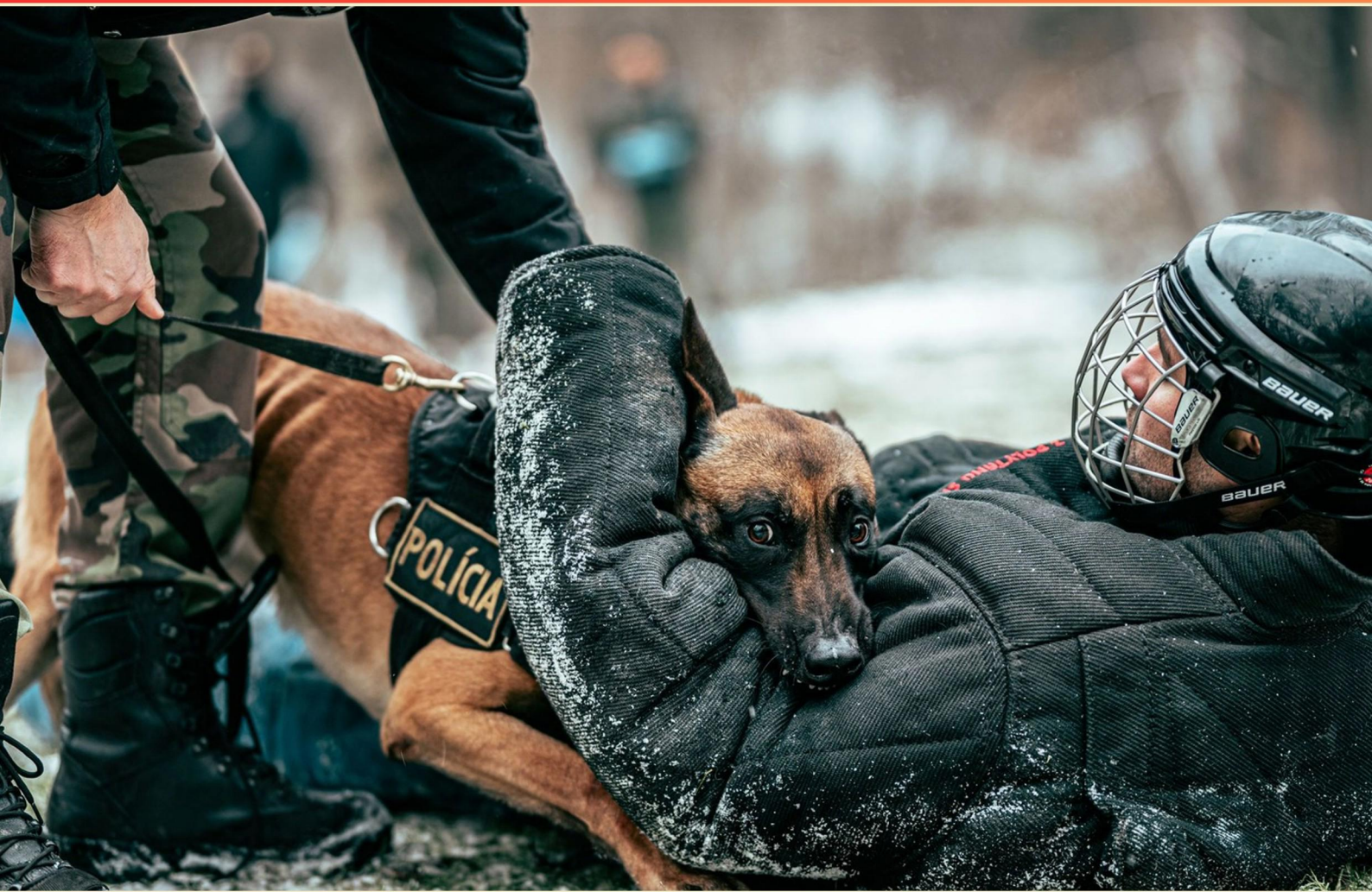

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Explanations

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1. Which statement describes a method of data analysis?

- A. It ensures data quality
- B. It focuses only on totals

The main idea here is validating that the data reflect real events. In data analysis, confirming that an event actually occurred is a concrete method you can use to improve accuracy: you cross-check records, verify against source documents or logs, and ensure the entry corresponds to a real incident rather than a duplicate, a misrecord, or a fabrication. When you validate that events are real, you avoid basing conclusions on false signals and you build trust in the results. While data quality is essential, that term describes overall trustworthiness of the data rather than a specific analytic step. Focusing only on totals describes a summary approach, not a method of analysis. And trying to remove all noise isn't realistic or a defined technique in practice; some noise is inevitable, and methods focus on reducing or accounting for it rather than eliminating it entirely.

Crime analysis is about turning crime data into actions that prevent crime. That insight lets law enforcement deploy resources more effectively, such as directing patrols to high-crime times and places, targeting interventions where they'll have the most impact, and evaluating whether those measures actually reduce crime. In short, the goal is to use data to stop crimes before they happen. The other options don't fit because they involve functions unrelated to analyzing crime data: public relations is about image management, payroll processing is about employee pay, and inventory management focuses on stock and supply.

The idea is to keep networks able to support lawful intercepts as technologies evolve, including digital and IP-based systems. It does not authorize spying by itself; it creates the framework for authorized intercepts and data access. The other options refer to names that don't match the actual act.

Other issues like GPS drift, data encryption, or battery life aren't specific to the pen register process and don't address this practical vulnerability.

IVTS stands for Informal Value Transfer System, a term used for informal networks that move value across distances without using formal banking channels. Hawala and hundi are classic examples. This is different from formal or institutional remittance methods, which go through regulated financial institutions. In practice, IVTS allows rapid cross-border value movement with less visible oversight, which is why it's a focus in discussions of illicit finance and counterdrug contexts.
